Estimated a Little Short of the Demand But Still it Will Do. (New York Times.)

The latest trustworthy estimates of the statistical position of wheat lead to the conclusion that the "requirements," of the importing countries in 1905 will be 62,000,000 quarters and that as the world's total supply available for export does not exceed 61,500,000 quarters there is a shortage of half a million quarters to be made up in some other way, even if all the wheat in sight is consumed. The quantity available for export in the season 1904-5 is calculated by the Liverpool Corn Trade News as follows:


