General.

An investigation made at Nantuxet, Mass., of the wrecked schooner Richard S. Leaning, which went ashore off Long Shoal during Sunday morning's gale, showed that her crew probably perished in the storm.

The Austrian steamer Lucia, Capt. Zachevich, from Trieste, arrived at Philadelphia with Captain Abery, his wife, and the crew of the British schooner Stewiacke, which was abandoned about 300 miles south of St. Michaels, December 12.

The Danish vessel Grede has arrived at St. Johns, Nfld., her captain injured and her mate dead as the result of her experiences in the fierce tornado that is now sweeping the coast.

The 18th of December was an anniversary day for Kentville as it marked the 35th year since the through opening of the Windsor and Annapolis railway.

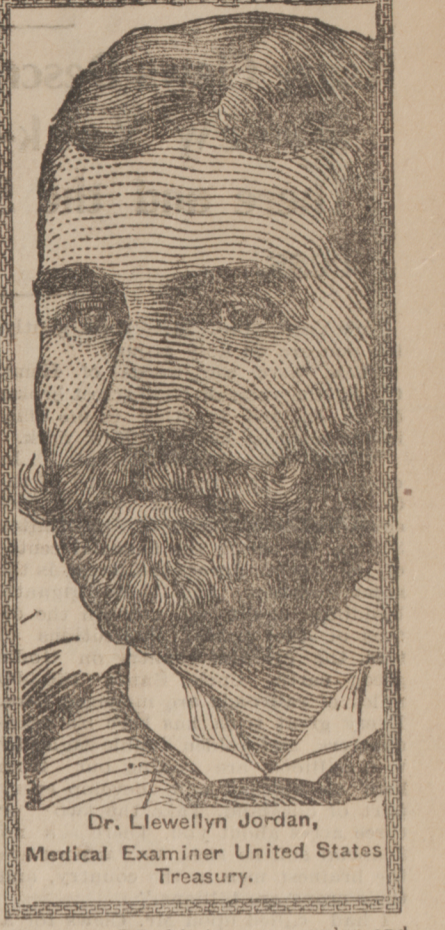
