

IS BRITAIN PREPARING TO HUNT RUSSIAN BEAR.

Halifax Stirred by Orders Alleged to Have Been Received for Army and Naval Forces--May be the Precursor of Actual War.

Halifax, Oct. 28.—(Special)—It was rumored about the city, last evening, that the Royal garrison artillery, stationed here, had received orders from the war office to hold themselves in readiness to proceed to Esquimaux B. C. so as to be nearer the base of operations, should the North Sea episode result in an open rupture between Great Britain and Russia.

There was also considerable stir in naval circles last night, when it was known that the flag ship Ariadne and cruiser Alert, had received orders to coal and the work was started last evening.
