

TRUE CANADIAN POLICY IS THAT OF MR. BORDEN.

The Manifesto of the Leader of the Opposition in Marked Contrast to the Policy of the Friends of the Grand Trunk.

Montreal, Oct. 25.—(Special.)—The leader of the conservative party, R. L. Borden, has issued the following message:—

To the People of Canada:— Parliament is now dissolved and political parties must submit themselves, their action and their policy to the judgment of the people.

Our policy has been clearly defined and consistent, the same in every quarter alike, and to every class.

The subject of most immediate concern is transportation, having regard to the enormous obligations which would be imposed upon the people by the government's rashly proposed adoption by the government of ownership of railways.

Canada For Canadians. The immense territory and ever increasing products of Canada demand the best and most economical transportation.

Reciprocal Trade Within the Empire. We believe that any extension of our markets by means of reciprocal trade arrangements should be sought among those within the empire who are our chief customers rather than in foreign countries.

More efficient means will be devised to guard against corrupt practices at election and to protect the electorate from fraudulent devices by which the will of the people has been so often thwarted and the name of Canada degraded.

A National Highway. We oppose to this our declared policy.

ALL NIGHT IN A DORY.

Nova Scotia Fisherman Has an Awful Experience on Maine Coast.

Portland, Evening Express, Oct. 22:—After battling for fifteen hours in an open boat with the terrific storm of yesterday afternoon and last night, Andrew Perry, formerly of this city, but now of Shelburne, N. S., was rescued at 3 o'clock this morning by the Plymouth, Mass. fishing schooner, Matchless and brought in to this port.

Perry is a member of the crew of the fishing schooner, Richard Numan, of Cape Porpoise. Yesterday he was out on his trawls when the storm came up and before he could get back to his vessel, it was so thick she could not be made out and she was probably unable to find him.

When Perry last had his bearings he was about ten miles off Portland Head Light and the only thing left for him to do was to prepare for a hard night of it in the small open boat in the hope that he might ride out of the storm or else be picked up by some passing vessel.

As the afternoon progressed the wind increased in fury until on land it was blowing at 50 miles an hour and out at sea it was tearing along at the rate of 60 and 70 miles.

The latter turned the schooner around and made in the direction of the port, and after a while discovered Perry in the dory and took him on board. The schooner arrived in this port early today with both Perry and his dory. The latter is a new craft and the Numan on which the fisherman belongs is also a new schooner, having only recently been launched.

Perry says he did not suffer very much as the weather was not cold and he is all right today after his experience. It is not known what became of the Numan as nothing has been heard of her since yesterday noon but it is supposed that she came through the gale all right.

The Matchless brought in one of the biggest trips of fish that has arrived at this port for several months, having had 50,000 lbs. of mixed fish, including cod, haddock, and hake. Her trip was caught on Cashe Bank which is about 50 miles east of Portland Head.
