## MEASURING THE EARTH.

The science of goedesy is making rapid strides along the line of accur-acy, anh there is not much left to be perfected in the way of method. The all-important problem of modern, as well as afficient, geodesy, of course, is the measurement of the dimensions of the earth, which enters into all practical work of surveying, naviga-tion, and tertestrial physics.
