AN INTERESTING SITUATION.

Theatres in St. John Said to be Operating Without a Civic License.

Shut in the steamroom of a Russian bath house in Hester street, New York, two young men were scalded to death yesterday before their plight was realized by the attendants.

An Ottawa despatch says:—Sir Wilfrid Laurier will visit Governor Willard of Virginia next summer. It is probable that he may meet Vice-President Fairbanks there or on his way going or returning.

The Rouvier Cabinet at Paris has begun work under the most favorable circumstances. Its overwhelming majority of 303 in the Chamber of Deputies Saturday night, is almost without precedent and in marked contrast with the majority of about forty on which the Combes Cabinet had struggled along for the last two years.

In the new parliament of Ontario the farming community has the largest representation there being twenty-one titlers of the roll in the house. Lawyers follow with eighteen; nineteen are merchants, 13 practicing physicians, eight journalists, six manufacturers, five contractors, four agents, two undertakers, two school inspectors, two cattle dealers, one auctioneer, and one principal of a correspondent school.

"Bills to guarantee the bonds of the Canadian Northern Railway for the further sum of \$2,860,000 were introduced in the Manitoba legislature Friday.

Pince Guirelli, an officer of the police guard, at Batoum Russia, while driving past the iron works yesterday morning, was shot and killed by an unknown man. No arrests have been made.

The Labor Gazette for January, just issued gives an account of the general condition of industry throughout Canada for the past year. The wage movement was stationary, though farm and unskilled labor received higher commodities were on the whole higher.

The 50th anniversary of Carleton Free Baptist church was celebrated yesterday with special services. In the morning there was an interesting and well attended conference led by Rev. Joseph Nobles.
