#### A VOICE FROM YORK.

At Coal Run, Ohio, recently, at a rehearsal of a private theatre, a man named Mason was to receive a dagger thrust from Stephen Rumble. A sack of red liquid was concealed under his clothes, and a wooden breast plate was to protect him. In the excitement of rehearsal the breast plate changed places, and the dagger went to Mason's heart. He died instantly.

According to a return made to the House of Commons of convictions for capital offences committed in the Dominion between the 1st of July 1867 and the 31st December 1876, it appears that there were 114 made. Of these 77 were for murder; 32 criminals were executed, 51 imprisoned for life, and 2 pardoned. The remainder received sentences of from 5 to 15 years.
