Application will be made by the Municipal Council of the County of York, to the Legislature of this Province at the next sitting thereof for the Enactment of the following Bills:—
1st. A Bill to enable the County Council of the Municipality of York, to issue Debentures to take up certain Debentures falling due in August next.
2nd. A Bill to empower the said Municipality to fix the salary of the Sheriff of said County.
3rd. A Bill to amend the Law relating to Municipalities, as far as relates to the County of York, in the manner following:—1st. By altering the time for Collectors to make their returns, to be on Saturday next after Election of Councilors, and compelling all Trustees to give bonds on receiving the delinquent list. 2nd. To enable the Councilors to hold their seats for two years.
4th. To appoint a Parish Auditor for each Parish whose duty it shall be to place in the hands of the Councilors a full and complete statement of the financial condition of the Parish previous to the January meeting, and that the Collectors shall hand to said Auditor a duplicate receipt of all monies paid by him.
5th. A Bill to authorize and empower the Municipality to Deed the Land granted to and vested in the Trustees of the Peace in the County of York in trust for a Burial Ground and School purposes for the inhabitants of Howard Settlement, in the Parish of Canterbury, to the Trustees of Schools for District No. 8, in the Parish of Canterbury for School purposes.
6th. A Bill to amend the Law relating to the Wild Land Tax, as far as relates to the County of York, by increasing the tax from one half cent to one cent on every acre.
7th. A Bill to amend the Law relating to the Administration of Justice between the City of Frederickton, and the Municipality of the County of York, so that the City will pay three-eighths (3/8) and the County five-eighths (5/8) of the expenses of the administration of Justice of the County.

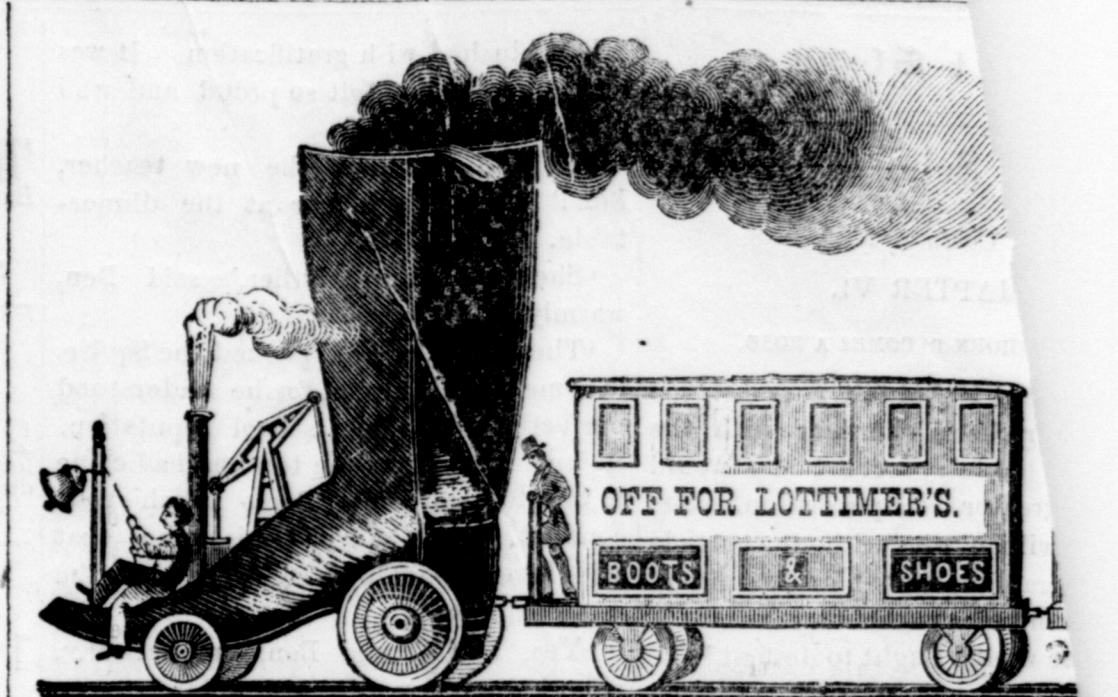
