

The Zulu Under Fire.
Except when in masses the Zulu is a difficult being to shoot. When on the move he runs as fast as a horse cantering; when halted he either crouches under rocks or lies concealed in the grass. When ready to fire he raises himself, discharges his weapon, and at once falls flat on his face. Until accustomed to these tactics our men are naturally inclined to return the enemy's fire instead of quietly waiting for the instant when he rises from his hiding place to advance and fire. Firing at moving objects might be practiced with advantage by marksmen and first-class shots. The best target shots are often indifferent deer stalkers. I have myself seen a Zulu jump up within twenty yards of a company of infantry and half a troop of volunteers, run the gauntlet of their fire for a hundred yards, and escape. Without examining the actual casualties caused by artillery fire, the manner in which the Zulu masses broke up on the bursting of the first shell proves with what dread the fire of our guns is regarded. Indeed, it is quite proverbial. Prisoners become almost ludicrously excited when questioned as to what they think of the "By-and-bye" (the Caffre name for cannon). "We see them coming through the air," they say, referring to the shells and imitating their hissing noise; "we get out of their way; they pass, strike the ground, then kill—we cannot understand. The rockets, a few of which were fired with the usual unsatisfactory results, and said to have spread greater terror among the Zulu ranks. They say: "Where did they come from? We think they must have been sent from the other side of the moon." Pointing to a high range of hills some miles distant. The Zulus were observed to shoot at the rockets as they flew hissing through the air.—*London Times Letter.*

A White Race in Africa.
Major Serra Pinto, the Portuguese traveler in Africa who recently turned up at Lisbon, has been lecturing on his travels at the Standard. He testifies distinctly to the existence of a white race in Central Africa, living in territory "between the Congo and the Cubango." He himself spoke to men of this race, whom he describes as "whiter than Caucasians," who call themselves "Assengues," and are not bad people, though totally uncivilized. They have tufts of hair on their heads, like short wool. They have eyes like the Chinese, are powerful, and live a nomadic life. It is of course possible that an albino family should have multiplied, but it is more probable that a small party of Vandals or Goths were forced southward, or tried to explore southward were compelled by circumstances to remain and, being separated from all around them by their color, have survived as a distinct tribe. An almost perfectly white tribe exists in the Atlas, the descendants, it is supposed, of Romans who fled to the mountains for protection against the barbarians, and as far as is known, climate has little influence on color. The Goths remain white and the Tasmansians were quite black, though they had always lived in a climate nearly identical with that of Britain.

A CROQUET OF NUMBERS.—The multiplication of 987654321 by 45 gives 444444445. Reversing the order of the digits and multiplying 123456789 by 45 we get a result equally curious, 555555555. If we take 123456789 as the multiplier again, we get 1234567890. Interchanging the figures of 45, take 54 as the multiplier, we obtain another remarkable product, 678901234. Returning to the multiplier first used, 987654321, and taking 54 as the multiplier again, we get 533333334—all three except the first and last figures, which read together 54, the multiplier. Taking the same multiplier and using 27, the half of 54, as the multiplier, we get a product of 266666667—all sixes except the first and last figures, which read together 27, the multiplier. Next interchanging the figures in the number 27, and using 72 as a multiplier, with 987654321 as the multiplicand, we obtain a product of 711111112—all ones except the first and last figures, which read together gives 72, the multiplier.

Denmark threatens to prove a formidable rival to Canada and the United States in the live stock trade with England. The Scandinavian cattle exhibited at the Newcastle wholesale market have represented of late more than two-thirds of the beasts offered for sale. The quality of them may be judged from the fact that considerable sales were made for the southern markets, to which none but the best sorts are sent. A quantity of stock is now fed on the best pastures in Denmark for the English markets. When prices are pretty stiff, the Danish cattle steamed, instead of waiting for cargoes of coals or goods, run out of northern ports in ballast, and return with a fresh supply in a remarkably short space of time. In time of war Copenhagen and the adjacent ports sending cattle to Newcastle are as near to it as Aberdeen is for the same purpose. Farmers in the north reckon upon this trade as thoroughly established, and as a growing one.

An improved torpedo of the Whitehead or Fish pattern has been sent to Portsmouth for a course of sea trials. It is capable of a high rate of speed, and maintains its velocity for a considerable range. It is also cheap, and as each torpedo costs about \$1,000, this is a considerable advantage. The purchase of the secret from Mr. Whitehead cost the British Government, with the improvements added, \$750,000. Many attempts have, of course, been made to discover the secret of manufacture, and in one instance the authorities were outwitted by a respectable looking man, who informed the officials that he had invented an improved version in the propeller, and induced them to allow him to take away part of the machinery.

The electric lighting of Gilmore's Garden, New York, is a complete success. The light furnished is equal to that of 1,840 gas jets, and costs but about eight dollars per night, including wear and tear of machinery, etc., while the cost of gas would be from sixty to seventy-five dollars per night for the same degree of illumination.
