Lt Col. Lazier, commanding the 15th Battalion, Belleville, Ont., has been dismissed by General Herbert. In today's Canada Gazette his name is removed from the list of officers who will cause a big row in the streets, circles and also in Parliament, owing to the circumstances. Col Lazier last autumn wanted the inspection of his corps postponed because he had interrupted the drill in order to comply with the request of Mr. Corby, M. P., for the use of the drill hall for a big Conservative demonstration in honor of Sir John Thompson and early all the cabinet members. The reason was that as the inspection was to be held in the morning, and as Napanea on the day fixed for the inspection, General Herbert was obstinate, however, and refused to postpone the inspection. Col Lazier announced that he would resign but General Herbert was apparently intended humiliating him by refusing to accept his resignation and dismissing him and asking for his resignation. The man of influence and money Col. Lazier was a leading supporter of the Conservative member, Corby, and for thirty years connected with the battalion. His dismissal will cause a military sensation.
