Canadian Gold Coinage.

The suggestion to establish Canadian gold coinage does not appear to meet with approval in banking circles in Montreal. Mr. E.S. Clouston of the Bank of Montreal in an interview with a representative of the Toronto World said: "I do not think there is anything in it. The requirements of Canadian trade are not such as to warrant the creation of gold coinage in this country at the present time, and it certainly would never pay the Canadian Government to establish a mint here.

"While the government," continued the general manager, "makes a very large profit out of the silver coinage it would not be so with gold. There is not, in fact, sufficient gold used in this country to justify such a coinage. It is, however, different in England where almost every man has sovereigns in peckets, while here if you happen to get a five or ten dollar gold piece you hasten to get it changed.

F'Canada is not as great a gold producing country as it may be in the near or distant future, and then it will be time enough to take the question of gold coinage into consideration. As it is at present gold is generally kept stored away in banks for use

in cases of emergency. "No," continued Mr. Clouston, "I do not see that any good can be got out of a gold coinage for Canada, either by the banks, the mercantile community or the country at large.'



Kerry is attracting much attention in Irish political circles. The new election in the district was rendered necessary by the decision of Denis Kilbride (anti-parnellite), who was returned from South Kerry and North Galway, to represent the latter constituency in the House of Commons. The anti-Parnellites at the regular convention selected Mr. Farrell as their candidate, but Mr. Murphy, who is ostensibly a member of the anti-Parnellite party, is contesting the district as an independent candidate. Justin McCarthy, head of the party, issued a manifesto to the electors on Monday in which he denounced the candidature of Mr. Murphy as treason against party discipline, and said it was due to conspiracy. For three years, he added, there had been an incessant campaign against the unity of party, which reached a climax Mr. Healy's baseless falsehood uttered at Onagh, where he charged that the anti-Parnellite committee had sold seats in the House of Commons for English gold.

William O'Brien, formerly one of the anti-Parnellite leaders in the House, spoke at Kerry yesterday in behalf of Mr. Farrell. In the course of his remarks he said that Mr. Healy proposed after the election in 1892 that the Irish party should not put Mr. Gladstone in power until he gave written pledges to appoint Nationalist magistrates and sheriffs and to promote policemen from the ranks. Mr. O'Brien further said that the night before Mr. Gladstone introduced the second home rule bill Mr. Healy, like other members of the Commons, was informed what the provisions of the bill were. Mr. Healy declared that Mr. Gladstone had swindled them and proposed when Mr. Gladstone stood up to propose the bill next day that the Irish party should rise and quit the chamber. Moreover, Mr. O'Brien added, it was by Mr. Healy's advice that the then Chief Secretary for Ireland, the Rt. Hon. John Morley, was boycotted by Irish members when he came to Ireland to ask their advice how to administer the affairs of the country. The speech has caused a sensation in Irish circles.

Newspaper Man Arrested.



Salisbury Warns Turkey.

A late dispatch from Constantinople says It is officially announced here that Rustem Pasha, Turkish Ambassador to England, has telegraphed to the Foreign Minister that he has had an interview with Lord Salisbury m. on the second and third Sundays in the relative to the Armenian question; whom he had assured that the sublime Porte is not opposed to the reforms proposed by the powers, signatory to the treaty of Berlin, but every first Sunday, and at 8 a. m. every third and fifth Sunday in the month, and on Holy Days at that Turkey could not permit control of Armenia by an International Commission.
