

Canadian Gold Coinage.

The suggestion to establish Canadian gold coinage does not appear to meet with approval in banking circles in Montreal.

"While the government," continued the general manager, "makes a very large profit out of the silver coinage it would not be so with gold."

"Canada is not as great a gold producing country as it may be in the near or distant future, and then it will be time enough to take the question of gold coinage into consideration."

"No," continued Mr. Clouston. "I do not see that any good can be got out of a gold coinage for Canada, either by the banks, the mercantile community or the country at large."

Mr. William Weir of the Banque Ville Marie was likewise seen, and that veteran banker expressed himself as follows: "I do not see any great advantage in a Canadian gold coinage, except perhaps the higher standing it would give us as a Dominion."

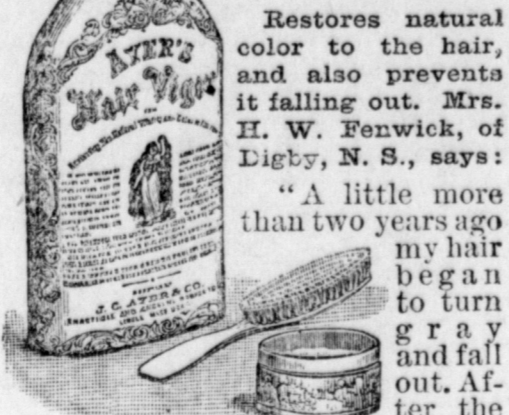

Irish Politics.

DUBLIN, Sept. 5.—The campaign in South Kerry is attracting much attention in Irish political circles. The new election in the district was rendered necessary by the decision of Denis Kilbride (anti-Parnellite), who was returned from South Kerry and North Galway, to represent the latter constituency in the House of Commons.

Justin McCarthy, head of the party, issued a manifesto to the electors on Monday in which he denounced the candidature of Mr. Murphy as treason against party discipline, and said it was due to conspiracy. For three years, he added, there had been an incessant campaign against the unity of party, which reached a climax Mr. Healy's baseless falsehood uttered at Onagh, where he charged that the anti-Parnellite committee had sold seats in the House of Commons for English gold.

William O'Brien, formerly one of the anti-Parnellite leaders in the House, spoke at Kerry yesterday in behalf of Mr. Farrell. In the course of his remarks he said that Mr. Healy proposed after the election in 1892 that the Irish party should not put Mr. Gladstone in power until he gave written pledges to appoint Nationalist magistrates and sheriffs and to promote policemen from the ranks. Mr. O'Brien further said that the night before Mr. Gladstone introduced the second home rule bill Mr. Healy, like other members of the Commons, was informed that the provisions of the bill were. Mr. Healy declared that Mr. Gladstone had swindled them and proposed when Mr. Gladstone stood up to propose the bill next day that the Irish party should rise and quit the chamber. Moreover, Mr. O'Brien added, it was by Mr. Healy's advice that the then Chief Secretary for Ireland, the Rt. Hon. John Morley, was boycotted by Irish members when he came to Ireland to ask their advice how to administer the affairs of the country. The speech has caused a sensation in Irish circles.

Newspaper Man Arrested.

BERLIN, Sept. 7.—The editor of the Socialist paper Vorwaerts has been arrested and all of the copies of last Sunday's edition of that paper have been seized in consequence of the publication of a leading editorial on the Selan Day celebrations. The charge against the editor is high treason. Today's editor of the paper criticizes the Emperor's fetes and speeches and declares that an explanation of the passage on the Kaiser's speech at the state dinner in the white hall of the castle on Monday evening, calling upon the guards to "Put down that treasonable band" (meaning the Socialists), has become imperative. The paper adds that adequate criticism of such threats as were indulged in by the Emperor is impossible on account of the public prosecutions already begun.

Salisbury Warns Turkey.

A late dispatch from Constantinople says: It is officially announced here that Rustem Pasha, Turkish Ambassador to England, has telegraphed to the Foreign Minister that he has had an interview with Lord Salisbury relative to the Armenian question; whom he had assured that the sublime Porte is not opposed to the reforms proposed by the powers, signatory to the treaty of Berlin, but that Turkey could not permit control of Armenia by an International Commission.

Lord Salisbury replied that, under the existing circumstances, it would be useless to continue the interview. If, he said, the Porte persists in its refusal, the Powers will undertake the suggested reforms.

If, however, the Porte continues to resist, Lord Salisbury added, it would be a signal for the dismemberment of Turkey. The dispatch has caused the greatest uneasiness here.

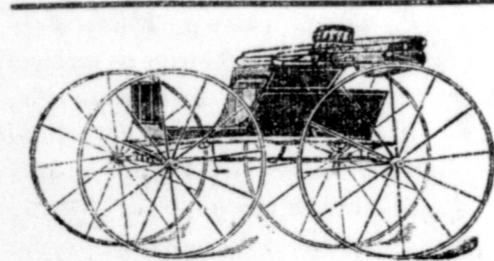
