London's Sewage.
Beyond the small sewage filtration plants in use in some New England towns the majority of cities in this country allow the wastes of the community to pollute the water courses. London, like all the other big European cities, treats all its sewage, the average quantity treated at the two chemical precipitation plants connected with the sewage system of the city being nearly 250,000,000 gallons a day in 1895.

Some interesting facts regarding the operation of these works are represented in a report on this subject by Mr. A. R. Binnie, chief engineer to the London County Council. The total quantity of sewage treated during 1895 was 89,830,000,000 gallons, an increase of 1.08 per cent. over the year 1894. The chemicals used were 48,959,000 pounds, or 3.8 grains per gallon of lime, and 11,277,280 pounds, of .88 grains per gallon of protosulphate of iron. The total amount of sludge produced was 2,169,000 long tons, or 4,858,650,000 pounds, which is about 5,400 pounds per 1,000,000 gallons. The average amount of moisture in the sludge was 91.42 per cent.

The total cost of the two chemical precipitation plants and the sludge ships used to convey the sludge to sea, has been \$4,728,770, of which \$662,322 was for the ships. The fixed charges on this capital account in 1895 amounted to \$248,000, and the operating expenses were \$507,000, making a total of \$755,000. This is equivalent to \$8.40 per 1,000,000 gallons for all charges and \$5.64 for operating expenses alone.

For precipitation expenses only the operating expenses were \$2.98, and for sludge disposal \$1.66 per 1,000,000 gallons of sewage treated. These totals for operating expenses are slightly increased by some experiments with filtering the effluent from the precipitating tanks.

Six sludge ships were in use, carrying an average of 1,000 long tons each, the fleet making 2,169 trips about 50 miles in length. The cost of transporting the sludge to sea was 3.48 pence, or 6.75 cents per long ton, which is .135 cents per ton-mile for the distance hauled out, or half that sum if the return trip is included in the distance.

For a Punctured Bicycle Tire.

For those who use inner tubes the following advice, in case of puncture, may prove acceptable: Clean the tubing thoroughly around the puncture with sandpaper, remove the white powder from the tube, cut a patch out of clear rubber, leaving ample margin, and apply to both tube and patch a thin coat of rubber cement. Dry about two minutes or until the benzine in the cement is evaporated. If possible, use two coats of cement on both patch and tube, allowing time for drying between the first and second applications: then apply the patch and be sure to press it down securely at every point. The inner tube is then ready to be returned to its place. Care must be taken while placing it to avoid liability of opening an air passage under the patch.

THE MUSINGS OF THE WICKED IMP.

PECULIAR FEATURE OF PARTY JOURNALISM.

The People Must Want It Thus or It Would Not be so Given.—A Bit of Advice to The County Councillors and Farmers in General.—Agitate For Better Roads.



I am watching the party newspapers now with a keen interest, and it certainly is a sight to make all the horses of the country laugh. A political newspaper is not for the purpose of representing such an event or such a meeting in the way in which its readers wish it to appear. Now, for instance, all good Tories wish that all the grit meetings throughout the country should be ill attended and lack enthusiasm; the grits wish the same about the Tories. So, the grits take the Telegraph, which plays the tune they are after, and the Tories take the Sun, which caters to their taste. Really, an independent man cannot find out anything about the probable result of the elections by the party papers. Both parties are "hallooing" before they are within distance of being out of the woods. Children may be deceived by all this; men, certainly not. Still there is some excuse. The public must be pleased. There is much in the pleasure of imagination. But if any optimistic prophet says that partyism is dead, let him make a few enquiries just now, and he will find that the day of calm reasoning and stalwart independence has not yet dawned.

It may be that the members of the county council will listen to reason when all the rest of the electorate is at fever heat over elections. The members of the council may not have all to do with the distribution of road money, I believe that largely lies with the representatives in the local legislature, but if the councillors take a stand they can accomplish a great deal. And, they should pass some kind of a resolution with respect to better roads. Probably the roads in this county are as good as in any other county, but they are not, by any means, what they should be. The day of building railways to every man's door is about gone by. Railways will not be built henceforth, excepting when there is a pretty certain thing that they are going to be paying investments. It becomes the farmers of the land to use all their influence in getting the highways put in first class shape. In starting such an agitation they will be backed by a class, who are neither small or unimportant—they are the bicyclists. The farmer may think the bicyclist a dude, but that makes no odds to the farmer provided the dude will join him in the agitation for good roads. I respectfully call the attention of the county councillors to this advice. It is money in their pockets if they follow it. Bad roads smash wagons, and wear out machinery, and horse shoes.

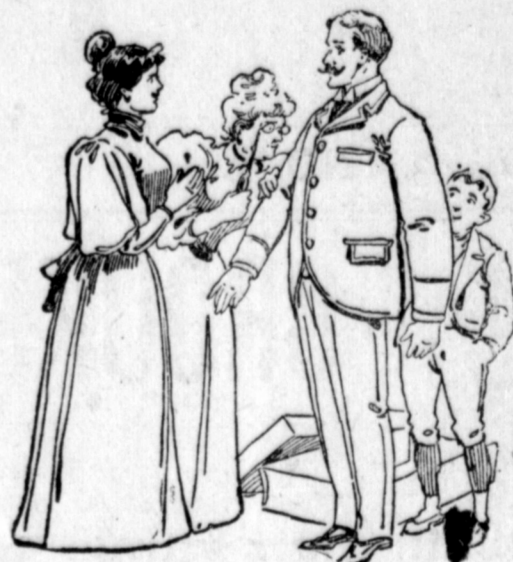
