**St. John a Winter Port.**  
A St. John Globe Ottawa correspondent recently sent her paper this communication to St. John as a winter port:—"The St. John deputation saw Mr. Blair and talked over with him the whole subject of a fast freight service for St. John, and harbor accommodation. As to any dredging or new wharf facilities it is understood that a survey of the harbor will precede any definite action. A vote for the cost of a survey is being taken. Although the interview with Mr. Blair was a long one, lasting until past one o'clock this morning, the delegates are rather vague as to their understanding of matters, and do not agree as to inferences to be drawn from anything Mr. Blair said. In fact Mr. Blair seems to have been extremely cautious in his statements and not in a position to say positively that anything definite was known in reference to the fast freight line. At all events Peterson, Tait & Company, the contractors, have agreed in their contract for the fast passenger line to provide a fast freight line to St. John; whether weekly or fortnightly is uncertain as yet. They do this under the one subsidy. The size of the boats they will put on is a matter of interest, but nothing definite can be learned as to that."
