SOMETHING ABOUT SPAIN.

It is said that the dispatches from Cuba, appearing in many of the large American papers are utterly unreiable. However this may be, many of us are apt to think of Spain as a country without responsible government. Such is not the case. The legislative authority of the kingdom is exercised by the Sovereign and a parliament called the cortez. The Senate or upper house is divided into three classes. (1) members by right of birth or office, grandies (2) members nominated by the king for life, (3) members elected by the state corporations, and by the most highly to the other two, which cannot exceed 180.

The chamber of deputies are elected for five years, in the proportion of one for every 50,000 of the population. The electors must be twenty-five years old, and have paid a land tax equal to \$5 for one year, or an industrial tax of \$10.00 for two years.

The kingdom is divided into provinces, and in each province is a lieut. governor appointed by the crown. There is a council in each province, the members of which are elected by members of the commune. As long ago as 1857 primary education was declared compulsary on all children of school age, and made free to the poor.

It will thus be seen that Spain has a liberal constitution.



The Moon Mountains.

The number of craters on the moon's surface is very large. A large luner map by Schmidt, published in 1878, includes about 32,000 of these formations, some of which are very deep. They are surrounded by ramparts, or walls, raised above the general level. The mountains are proportionately high; one peak, named Newton, has an elevation of 24,000 feet. There are also ring moutains varying from 10 to 50 miles in diameter. The surface also displays a number of ray-centres, particularly at the time of full moon, when they may be seen to great advantages. These consist of a bright central objects, with luminious radiations stretching in different directions.
