Twenty days notice of time and place of holding election to be given by Parish Clerks by posting in three most public places in Parish. Nomination of candidates to be filed with Parish Clerks be-fore six o'clock P. M. on Monday the 4th October. Parish Clerks to post names of Candidates in three of most public places in each polling district on 7th October The Parish Clerks and District Clerks to act as Chairman unless they rhe refuse to serve when chairman to be chosen by electors. Collectors of Rates are required to furnish Parish Clerk with list of Electors ten days before election. Dated Sept. 9th 1897.
