Our National Weakness.

The European powers, though jealous of the rapid progress and great prosperity of the United States, are also aware of the thoroughly peaceful character of our people and our Government. Their jealousy of us is a trifling matter when compared with their jealousy of one another. All that is necessary to save us from European interference is to know our own mind, to be less boisterous in talk, and to be more prompt and decisive in action. To justify one-fiftieth part of the talk we have done in this country, we ought long ago to have driven out the Spaniards and emancipated Cuba. It is not the sensational newspapers that have had a sole monopoly of the talking. Presidents, cabinets, diplomats, and above all Congress, have done their full share. The discussions of the Cuban question in the messages of President Cleveland and President McKinley have been of a nature which in any European country would have been promptly followed by the mobilization of troops and a declaration of war. From the moment when Mr. Cleveland made his famous intimation that we should have to interfere on high grounds of humanity if the Cuban war were not soon ended, a war between this country and Spain has been practically inevitable.—From "The Progress of the World," in the American Monthly Review of Reviews for May.

Canada and Canadian products continue to attract attention in old-world markets. On Wednesday Mr. Alex. Cowan of Balblair, Rosshire, Scotland, called on Hon. John Dryden, Minister of Agriculture. Mr. Cowan is the proprietor of the oldest distillery in Scotland, and the object of his visit to Canada is to find out whether Canadian barley is adapted for use in distilleries. Mr. Cowan says the home supply is very much short of the demand, and the Scotch distillers have to depend on other European countries to make up the shortage. His attention was directed to the Canadian article by Mr. W. G. Stuart, the Dominion agent for North of Scotland, who had some samples. If the barley is found to be satisfactory, and there is no reason to doubt that it will, a profitable trade in this staple will be open to Canadian farmers.

When he could utter nothing else, he could still murmur the word "Jolly." We are becoming a very sad race. "Merry" and "Jolly" are words seldom heard amongst us. If we laugh we are afraid we will be thought drunk, and be summoned as a Scott Act witness. Like the old Puritans we felt that we must always be psalm singing, through our noses or the value of our vital piety will be questioned. Are we becoming a country of hypocrites? How hard we are on the Spaniards with their treachery. Why? They stab behind the back, we say. Do not we? The Spaniard simply uses a knife, we do the act with a sharp malicious word. The Spaniard is the more manly of two such typical desperadoes. No! the Spaniard is on the whole quite as good as the Canuck, and not one bit more treacherous. I see Mr. Chancey Depew has been celebrating his birthday. Says a Boston paper:

Dear, old Mr. Depew! In celebrating his latest birthday he takes occasion to remark that in looking back over his career, the thought that gives him most satisfaction is that he has never consciously caused any one to shed a tear, and has done his best to make people laugh. Then he expatiates on the advantages of a cheerful disposition, and says that the man who can honestly laugh with his whole soul and his whole being will never betray a friend, never defraud a creditor, never cheat his neighbor, never deceive a woman, but will go through the world making friends, and, more difficult still, keeping all the friends he makes. Carking care, of which Horace speaks as always trying to ride behind us or on the same ship, has a hard time of it if we are determined to be cheerful and make others cheerful. All of which is good philosophy for these anxious times.

Goldwin Smith is the deepest thinker in Canada, as well as the most brilliant writer. Indeed, his fame is world wide. Interviewed on the situation, Mr. Smith said that the better class of the people of the United States with whom he had come in contact during his stay across the border were in favour of a peaceful solution of the difficulty with Spain. "My own decided impression, is that the United States is being hurried into war before the resources of diplomacy have been exhausted, and when Spain is offering considerable concession, by the violence of Congressional fire-eaters and the sensation press against the good sense of the community. War about the destruction of the Maine is manifestly premature. The act has not been traced to the Spanish Government or any one connected with it; nor has any demand for indemnity been made and refused."
