OUR FORESTS.

We have an immense wealth in oar forests. They have in the past, yielded us millions on millions of dollars. Lumber has been the gold of New Brunswick, and the mine is by no means grhausted. Strange to say while the forest have become somewhat depleted, the price of lumber instead of going up, appears to be on the downward grade. Still lumber must always be in demand, and we will be a wise people if we take steps to preserve this great wealth that nature has endowed us with. But every lumberman. and every one familiar with the woods, knows that we have been most wasteful in our lumbering operations. Even the farmer who with a few hundred acres of woodland cuts some cords of firewood for the local market, wastes quainties of wood, for the comparitively little he sells.

The following taken from the Railway News, a Chicago journal, shows how careful they are in the old countries over their forest preservation: "After the many centuries during which the forests of Bohemia have turnished fuel and building material for a dense population it is said that they retain nearly their primeval area. This is due to the forethought of the government in ordaining that as trees are cet down others shall be planted to fill the vacancies. The wood is mostly pine. Trees are constantly being cut, but wherever a clearing is made small trees are planted the next spring. These . new trees are raised from the seed in small inclosures scattered in the mountains, and are thence transplanted." If we had adopted such a policy years ago, we would have been enabled to sell pine, today, and what a good price, pine would bring.



Verily, we are drifting to perfection !


