For the Household. FOR HOUSE PLANTS.

"Tobacco water," says a women whose house plants are a joy to the entire neighborhood, "is a most excellent wash. Take a handtul of tobacco stems and steep them by pouring boiling water over them until the water looks like strong tea. When the water is cool, wipe off the leaves and stems with a soft cloth. This removes insects and keeps the plant in good condition. The infusion weakened still further may be poured about the roots with good effect."

TO HANG THE PICTURES.

Often in hanging pictures the greatest difficulty is experienced in getting the screw to fasten securely into the plaster. Here is a simple remedy which many professional picture hangers follow in the course of a day's work: The hole made by the screw is enlarged and the edges of the plaster are thoroughly moistened with water. Then the space is filled with plaster of paris and the sorew pressed in to the soft plaster. When the plaster became hardened the screw will be found to hold very firmly.
