An Indian Artificial Lake.

Jai Samund, or Sea of Victory, near Odeypore, is the biggest artificial sheet of water in India. It is made by the Maharaja Jai Singh at the end of the seventeenth century. Apart from its size and beauty the lake strikes anyone visiting it for the first time by the marvellous simplicity of its construction. This inland sea, covering some thirty or forty square miles of land, in some cases to the depth of over 100 feet, has been created and kept in existence for a couple of centuries by one marble wall scarcely 300 yards long. In comparison with the lake this "bund" is small in the extreme, but in reality it is a white marble structure of marvellous strength and simple beauty. Along its whole length shining steps of pencilled white lead down to the water's edge at this time nearly thirty feet below the summit of the "bund." On the reverse side a second wall backs the "bund" proper. Till recently the space in between was unfilled, and formed a vast sort of cavern where both tigers and dacoits have been run to ground in not remote years. The present maharaja has spent much in filling up this empty space, with the triple benefit of ousting marauders, strengthening the "bund," and making a promenade or terrace along its whole length. — Lahore Tribune.

Progress of the White Pass and Yukon Ry.

We have official information that the White Pass & Yukon Ry. has now pushed its road-bed construction eight miles beyond Log Cabin, B. C., but there is considerable rock work yet to be done between the Summit and Log Cabin, along the shores of the Summit lakes. There is at present a force of about 600 men at work, and as soon as the weather improves this number will be increased and construction advanced as rapidly as possible. It is now expected that Lake Bennett will be reached with the rails about July 1, or August 1 at latest. Much depends upon the ability of the company to hold its laborers, as the force is being constantly reduced by reports of gold strikers in various parts of the country. The company is now constructing 20 box and flat cars in addition to rolling stock previously reported (Railway and Engineering Review.)

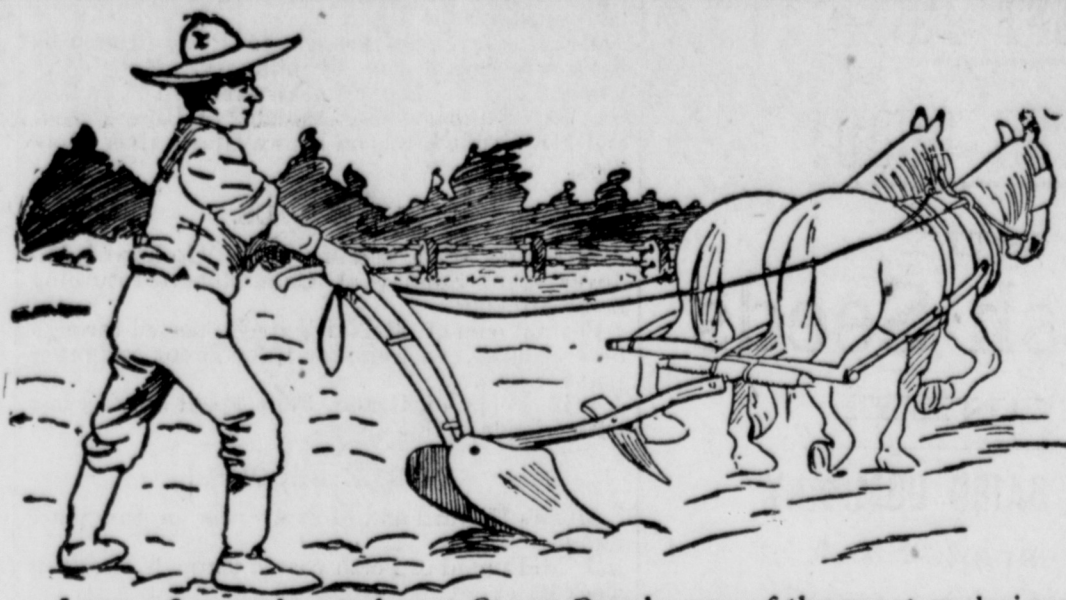
