A PECULIAR CASE.

George Phillips, of Carleton Creamery Co. is Probably Now on His Way to the Old Country. The Following Dispatch relates how he came to Himself in New York.

WORCESTER, Sept. 18.—A well dressed man walking along Broadway, New York, suddenly stopped Saturday night, looked around in bewilderment, and after a little while went to a policeman and said:

Purchasing a ticket for Webster, he boarded the train, having in mind the fact that Rev. Irving Barnes, who also married a daughter of J. L. Bacon, had resided in that town.

On the train he recalled that Mr. Barnes had moved to Sturbridge and was the pastor of the Fiskdale Advent church, so when he arrived in Webster his mind changed again, and he bought a ticket for New Haven and went there.

After that he was impelled to purchase a ticket from New Haven to New York, so he secured a state room on a boat and arrived, as he remembers it, in the early morning.

While in New York he travelled around all day never thinking of home at all, and interested himself in the sights of the city.

As he was walking along the street his reason returned to him like a flash.

He says he had every faculty he could have when well; no pains; could transact any little business necessary intelligently, avoid all dangers and act in a manner that would not attract the policemen.

He was himself except in the same old forgetfulness of home and family.

He doesn't know why he went away, nor can he offer any explanation except that something impelled him onward.

He was careful for at the Bacon home yesterday, given refreshments at once and then induced to go to bed.

After a while relaxation and reaction came, and sleep overpowered him.

It was decided that Mr. and Mrs. Phillips should go on the next trip of the Pavia to London, where his mother has made all arrangements to place her son under the care of a noted specialist.
