When your birds have bowel disease, change the food for a few days and at the same time change the grit.

All small fruits should be planted far enough apart to admit of using the horse cultivator.

So far as it is possible large limbs should never removed from plum and cherry trees. Thrifty, growing trees yield the finest looking fruit; old and nutured trees the richest

No variety of pears will ripen so finely on the trees as they will when gathered and

ripened in the house. Good feeding must attend rapid growth in trees and plants as well as in animals. Make the soil in the orchard rich.

With the peach the young trees should be started with low heads, the lower limbs not more than two feet above the ground.

Lice on trees may be killed by dissolving a pound of potash in a gallon of water and applying on the affected parts with a brush.




A Just Rebuke.

This immediately drew forth the remark from a quiet looking individual sitting at the other end of the table:


