

The Boer Prisoners in Ceylon.

The 2,000 Boer prisoners destined for Ceylon are to go to Bandarawela, which is the terminus of the Colombo and Kandy line, and 6,200 feet above sea level. The place is among the mountains and in a supremely healthy locality, with trees of rhododendrons growing upon the hillsides, and amid the grassy sward known as 'patenas.' The rhododendrons are not bush-like as in this country, but real trees with most lovely red flowers. They have somewhat long stems and then a crown of leaves and flowers. There are no tea-gardens so high up as Bandarawela, but cardammos are grown a little lower down. There is an excellent hotel near the railway terminus, owned by a company, and very well managed. Officers quartered there will be in clover, and in touch with all the world, thanks to the 'Observer' and the 'Times of Ceylon,' the railway and the post-office. The railway is almost unique as a feat of engineering skill, and only comparable with that running through the St. Gothard Pass. The 'soda water bottle curve' is one of the sights of the island, and a triumph of the art of the railway engineer. Adam's Peak 7,000 feet high, is in full view from the line, and few iron roads in the world pass through more interesting native villages and towns, through more exquisitely luxuriant vegetation, fields of 'paddy,' rivers, lakelets, etc., than the one starting in Colombo and terminating at Bandara wela. - 'St. James Gazette.'
