There are few public offices so august and to comfortable as that of Speaker of the British House of Commons. To begin with the emoluments: The Speaker's salary is twenty five thousand dollars a year; there are miscellaneous allowances which amount to almost as much more, and to these is added a handsome official residence such as a prince might envy. Moreover, while the Speaker listens to the speeches of dull members or restrains the language of the impetuous, he is sustained by the reflection that, whenever he is inclined to give up the office, he can retire with a peerage and the assurance of receiving a check for a thousand pounds every three months for the rest of his days. Such reflection might well beguile the most tedious debate.

The Speaker has great power. No member of the house can speak in debate except with his consent. He can stop any member whom he regards as using unparliamentary language, and can suspend him if he chooses. He can close any debate; he decided finally nice points of parliamentary law, for his rulings are never disputed.

These powers might be abused by a partisan; but the Speaker never is a partisan. One of the considerations which determines his selection is that he shall be satisfactory to both parties. He is nominated by the leader of the government party, and nomiation is seconded by the leader of the opposition. When the office becomes vacant the government chooses for Speaker a member of the party in power; but if there is a change of government he is not displaced, even after an election at which his party is defeated.

Under the American system, it is not possible that the Speaker of the House of Representives should be so colorless a person as the Speaker of the House of Commons is expected to be. The British ministers have seats in Parliament, and are the leaders of the house. In this country the separation of executive and legislature functions deprives the House of official leaders, and the dominant party needs the office of Speaker as an aid in impressing its policy upon legislation. Nevertheless, within these recognized limitations, Speakers who were robust partisans have shown themselves capable of great fair. ness toward political opponents -- The Youth's Companion.

The minority of the committee, said its chairman, Mr. Wadworth, of New York, was as anxious as the majority to prevent the fraudulent sale of oleomargarine as butter, but it recognized the value of oleomargarine as a wholesome article of food, and did not believe in taxing one American industry to make a market for another. Mr. Bailey, of Texas, declared that the avowed purpose of the bill to prevent fraud was itself fraud. The substitute was defeated by a vote of 113 to 178, and the Grout bill passed by a vote of 196 to 92. Nearly all the votes against the bill were cast by Democrats. There appears to us but one argument against

the bill-a doubt whether the taxing power of the government should be used for any other purpose than raising revenues. If it ever may be so used, it would be to prevent a wholesale fraud on the people, and the sale of oleomargarine as butter is such a fraud. Otherwise why color it at all?

Dr. Drummond, the well known poet and sportsman, in speaking recently at a dinner in Quebec to the toast "Fish and Game Interests," said :-- If the Government "should appoint competent game wardens; send them to the hunting grounds early in March; keep them there until the moose had aeserted their winter quarters, and pay these forest guardians commensurate with the duties they are expected to faithfully perform-would this be an extravagant or sinful waste of the public moneys? Not at all. I know of no investment better calculated to return certain and large profit than this one. A male moose today in Quebec is worth to the province from \$200 to \$300, and there are thousands of sportsmen outside of our province who would willingly invest that sum, for the plea sure of securing in a fair and legitimate manner, a trophy of this species. And the same general statement applies to all our game; fish, fowl and fur; each variet has its own special value, and it is our duty as a people to recognize this truth, and act accordingly."







The Oleomargarine Bill.

The most important measure passed by the House of Representatives last week was the Grout bill increasing the tax on oleomargarine from two cents a pound to ten cents. This increase is, indeed, limited to oleomargarine colored so as to look like butter, and the tax on uncolored oleomargarine is by the bill reduced to one-half of one cent a pound; but as nearly all dealers would find uncolored oleomargarine unsalable for table use, the nominal reduction of the tax on the uncolored product is not deemed important. Mr. Grout, of Vermont, and the other champions of the bill urged that it ought to be passed to prevent fraud, and they showed that oleomargarine is now being sold in stamped packbeating out many fossil formulas at a quarter a box. 
