The great wool-producing countries of the world (in order of production) are Australasia (Australia and New Zealand), Argentina, the United States, Russia, Great Britain and Ireland, France, South Africa and Uruguay. Lasser, but still important, wool producers are the British West Indies, Spain, Asiatic Russia, Germany, Austria-Hungary, Italy, Canada and Portugal. The approximate figures of production are as follows:

Australasia (average of ten years ended Uruguay......112,600,000 Canada..... 12,000,000 Austra-Hungary..... 55,000,000 Italy..... 22,000,000 Portugal..... 10,500,000 Asiatic Russia..... Persia..... 

"The above figures for the main countries of production are accurate enough, as representing the 'general average production' of the countries they refer to. But for other countries, especially the countries of the interior of Asia, they are mere estimates."

On Monday or Tuesday last a seizure was placed on all the property and effects, hose, reels, engines, police stations, funds in the bank, etc., of the town corpora tion of Levis, Que. King Boot and Shoe Company, which latter recently remoded from Levis, closing its factories there and removing its plant, owing to the corporation's refusal or neglect to pay the bonus of \$1,000 a year which it had agreed to pay to the company for a certain number of years, in consideration of the King establishment being placed within its limits. Finally, the company sued and got judgment in its favor, but the corporation appealed. The appeal, however, was set aside, and still the corporation neglected to pay. Then the King Company took out an execution, and executed it as aforesaid.




