A HOWITZER BATTERY.

A Gun of the Same Style as a Mortar. which Throws 10,000 Yards.

In the first cheering despatches from Gen. Buller's force on Jan. 18, it was mentioned that the Boers were being shelled with the how: zers. Some facts concerning this new arm will prove acceptable. The battery mentioned or that occasion, No. 37 (Howitzer) Battery Field Artillery, left Southamp ton on Nov. 17, 1899. Howitzers had not prior to this been tested in actual warfare, but experiments made from time to time have shown them to be terribly destructive. Those used by the British, are six inchbreech loaders, and weigh 2,500 cwt. each and the carriages are of the same weight. There is a considerable difference between howitzers and ordinary cannon. The latter are made to act by direct fire. in other words, to strike the face of the object aimed at, while the howitzers drop their shells over the object and spread havoc in the rear. Cannon can only be elevated to an ordinary degree, but from 45 to 65 degrees of elevation is a common thing for howitzers. They are chiefly used for siege purposes, each bat tery consisting of seven howitzers, the whole manned by 315 officers and men. As smokeless powder is used, and the weapons are fixed from behind entrenchments, no intimation is given to the enemy of their exact whereabouts, an additional terror thus being added to their use.



English Sunday Laws. There are some curious Sunday laws still unrepealed. One old English act states that "no one shall use, empl y or travel upon the Lord's day in any boat, barge or lighter, unless it be an extraordinary occasion, under a penalty of 5 shillings fine or two hours in the stocks." According to the law made in 1603 a fine of one shilling was inflicted on all perons over nine years of age who were not resent at their parish church on Sundays, and the act further goes on to say that all churchwardens were compelled, under a penalty of £20, to enforce this law. Several instances are on record of people being fined for absence from church. One of the latest courred in 1817, when Sir Montague Burgoyne was prosecuted at Bedford for having b en absent from the parish church, for several months. He was, however, let off on the evidence of the doctor. But in 1864 Isaac Watton, a manservant, was fined 9 shillings and 9 pence for refusing to go to church on Sunday when asked to do so by his mistress.
