Returned From Clover.

It does look like wasting money—just on the face of it—to purchase expensive clover seed, get a poor catch, and then have it last only two years. Unfortunately we can't change the habit of the plant. It is a biennial, and goes out naturally at the end of the second year. Usually a certain amount of self-seeding takes place, and sometimes a few plants live over till the third year, so that it does not disappear entirely if we give it a chance to flower and form seed. Clover costs from 12 to 16 cents a pound at the present time. This means that it costs us approximately \$1.50 per acre for seed. When a man has 10 or 20 acres to seed down it amounts to quite a sum; still, I don't think that there is any cheaper form of manure than that secured by investing \$1.50 in clover-seed. The catch must be a very poor one indeed that will return you less than this amount in humus and nitrogen. The fact of the matter is, we Northern farmers can't get along without it. We need it in balancing up our cattle ration; we should have it in our pasture, and as a soil-restorative it is all powerful. Clover first by all means, chemicals if we must.—[Professor Craig of Cornell University in Rural New Yorker.

Ear Corn vs. Ensilaged as Cattle Food.
I have carefully looked up all the available records bearing on the question as to whether dry ear corn or corn in the silo is most valuable as cattle food. Careful experiments made by the experiment stations show that the digestibility of corn in the silo (I am now speaking of the stalks as well as of the ears)

is about the same as of the dried fodder. The advantage of the silo product rests on the fact that the fibre of the stalk has been softened, and the cob with the corn is cut up into small pieces and is also softened by the heating action, so that the entire product is eaten by the cows. In this way there is less waste. Experiments carried on by the Kansas station for two years go to show that corn-and-cob meal gave better results than corn-meal fed alone. In this case, the corn and the cob were ground together very fine, and the trial showed that a pound of this mixed corn-and-cob meal was fully equal to a pound of the pure corn meal. Here, then, there is a distinct gain, because the cob represents about 20 per cent. of the total weight of the ear.—Prof. John Craig of Cornell University in Country Gentleman.

TO BREED A RACE OF GIANTS.

An Amazing Enterprise to be Started This Year in France.

The attempt to breed a race of giants, for which purpose a Frenchman, Count St. Ouen de Pierrecourt, has left an endowment of \$2,000,000 is to be begun this year at Rouen, France. To regenerate the French people, and ultimately, the entire human race is the announced purpose of the count in bequeathing this great fortune. His scheme is practically one of selective propagation. His money is left as a fund for encouraging giants and giantesses to marry. One per cent. will be given away thus each year. One couple, selected every twelve-month, will therefore receive the neat and comfortable sum of \$20,000, a nest egg with which to commence housekeeping and with which to support the little giants and giantesses which the stork may happen to drop down the chimney. The fund has been bequeathed to the city and the principal will last indefinitely.

A matrimonial agency for giants only will be immediately established in Rouen. There a board of medical men will examine candidates who apply. The healthiest couple who present themselves will annually be chosen for wedlock.

Whether the French count hopes to bring the race back to the standard of ante-deluge times is not known. It would be a queer world if he did so. According to estimates based upon Biblical data Adam was 123 feet 9 inches and Eve 118 feet 9 inches tall. Accepting this as true, they were about the height of our modern 10-story buildings. To increase humanity to the proportions of Adam would be neither economic nor convenient. If built according to the proportions of the average man of modern times he must have weighed something like 70,000 pounds, and must have required 440 times as much food as a normal individual of today. Thus a ham sandwich sufficient to gratify his voracious noon-day appetite would cost him \$2,200, and a reasonable slice of pie or cup of coffee the same. His minimum for a quick lunch would be \$6,600. He would wear a 318 inch collar, and the seams of his trousers would measure 60 feet. A skyscraper taller than the Eiffel tower and as wide as the Capitol at Washington would be a moderately small house for him to occupy. In other words, there would have to be a vast expansion in currency to maintain such a race, which would over-populate the earth to such a degree that vast multitudes would have to be killed off every year. Unless domestic animals and vegetables were enlarged in proportion their extinction would result within a year.

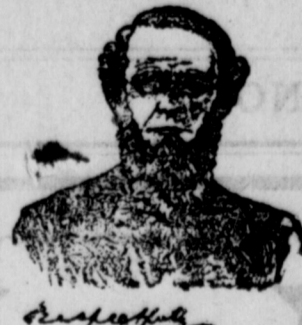
