A Serious Disease

There is a disease quite prevalent in many quarters in these days concernining which all medical treatises are silent, and which no doctor of medicine ever attempts to cure. The technical name of it is megacephalus, from the Green mega, name being "big-head." The germ of the repairs. disease is conceit as to one's own importance. It involves no enlargement of the cranial capacity, and no real enlargement of the brain itself, but is rather a swollen sense of self-importance, an over-estimate of personal worth. he Russian navy, to judge from the reports of a court-martial recently held at Sebastopol. The findings of the court were that the prisoner, Lieut. Roshtchakoffsky, had been publicly insulted by Midshipman Ilovaisky, that he sought official permission from the Court of Naval Arbitrators to challenge the latter to a duel, but was refused permission to do so, the Court of Arbitrators recommended him as a preliminary step to ask for three days' leave from his ship. Roshtchakoffsky, ignoring the recommendation of the arbitrators took the matter into his own hands, challenged Ilovaisky to fight, and at the place of meeting, on February 10 of this year, fired at his opponent six seconds before he was authorized to do so by the rules of the duelling. The court held that he fired accidentally, but in a fit of abject terror and cowardice despicable in an officer. It was to be noted, however, that, terrified as he was, he was able to shoot straight enough to mortally wound his adversary, who died the same night. A charge of deliberately and with malice prepense firing before the time appointed by the seconds in attendance was found not proven. The sentence was that Rostchakoffsky should be confined in a fortress for three years, without deprivation of civil rights or privileges. Whether or not he will be allowed, at the expiration of that period, to resume his rank in the navy does not appear. Whatever happens, it is improbable that he will ever again find anybody willing to fight a duel with him, no matter big, and ce-phalus, head, the common how badly his honor may stand in need of
