Cure For Pimples.

The girl whose face is covered with tiny pimples, or even one or two of annoying eruptions, is generally in misery, and in consequence, we see heavy veils, which are injurious to the eyes.

Unless there are some organic trouble, something wrong with her constitution and blood, there is absolutely no need of the appearance of these pimples; and we may decide either that the girl is negligent and really does not take the proper care of herself; or that she is not well.

Wash your face well three times a day in warm water and a bland soap. Most of the pimples and especially the blackheads are caused by the pores which have become enlarged and have secreted little particles of dust which blow on the face, and in this way have become clogged. The warm water and friction will remove the blackheads and the pimples.

This formula is an excellent one and should be used every night. Do not on any account rub it into the face, but place some of the cream on each separate pimple, let it remain overnight, and wash away in the morning with warm water and a pure soap.

Lanolin, five grains; sweet almond oil, five grains; sulphur precipitated, five grains; oxide of zinc, two and one-half grains; place sulphur in a mortar and then add the almond oil until a smooth paste is made, next add the lanolin and of violet extract one-half gram.

Better with this prescription as with the others, get a druggist to compound it for you.

If the skin is inclined to be oily, bathe the face in witch hazel and rose water of equal parts.
