Water and Potatoes. There is no farm crop that is more easily, speedily, and greatly affected by the supply of moisture than is the potato. It has been found by experiment that it takes about 425 tons water to grow a ton of dry matter of potatoes. A crop of 200 bushels per acre would, therefore require approximately 650 tons water; equivalent to a rainfall of nearly six inches. Because of its need for large water supply and its remarkable susceptibility to climatic conditions, it follows that the average potato yield is affected more by water supply than by lack of plant food. The selection of soil and methods of culture must be with these facts in view, if success is to be had. The liberal application of fertilizers or the presence of large amounts of readily available plant food will prove of little value if the moisture supply is deficient. It is also true that too much water will check the growth as quickly and effectually as too little. - [American Agriculturist.]

More Buffaloes in Canada. Buffaloes are, says the New York Sun, increasing in such proportions in Canada that they promise in the course of a few years to become again fairly abundant. Some time ago they threatened to become extinct. The herds of woods buffaloes in the Peace River district has trebled in size under the protection afforded it by the Northwest Mounted Police. Five years ago it was estimated that there were not more than eighty buffaloes in the herd; now there are 400. In appearance there is little difference between the woods buffalo and the plains buffalo. The former is merely a larger, richer-coated animal. It differs materially, however, in its habits from the sub-species which inhabited the plains, and which has undoubtedly passed away, except for the presence of a few animals in

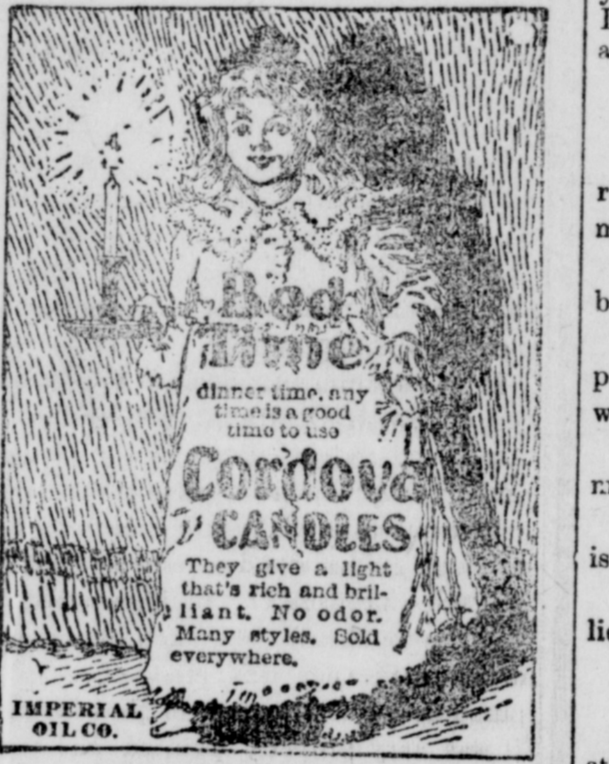

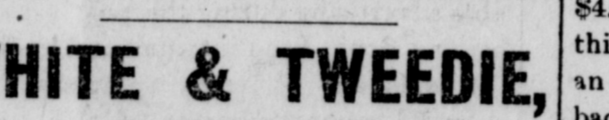

Grinding His Wheat. A Pennsylvania farmer who has studied the wheat question says he can do better in Chester County by having his wheat ground at one of the country mills than by selling it and buying flour. He figures it out thus: With wheat at 80c. per bushel, five bushels, enough to make a barrel of flour, are worth \$4. The miller will charge 50c. for grinding this, and the barrel is worth 25c. This makes an investment of \$4.75. The farmer gets back a barrel of better flour than can be bought on the market at \$5 per barrel, and he has also a lot of middlings worth \$1. This practice has been followed for a period of years, and several mills were patronized, with about the same results in all cases.—[Country Gentleman.]
