"Much spoil can be made by selling the whole lot to Barbadoes, where slaves fetch good prices in rum and sugar, and we shall not only do the Lord great service by punishing the wicked, but we shall make great good for his minister and people.
"Master Huscott feels hopeful, and I will set down the news when the ship comes back.

Canada's Great Schemes.

The Boston Herald is of the opinion that Canada is showing a wonderful enterprise in self-development. One sign of it is the projected fast steamship lines across the Atlantic in connection with the Canadian Pacific Railway. Another is the projected trans-continental railway, paralleling the present one, but far northward of it, so that, as regards local business, at any rate, they will hardly be competitors. There is a Great West of Canada which is rapidly filling up with settlers. Thousands have emigrated to it from the United States during the present year, and thousands more have come from Great Britain. The new railway line is designed to encourage this population. Starting from Port Simpson, on the Pacific, it will go through the Pine, or the Peace River Pass, through the Peace River district in Athabaska, thence south-west across the north-eastern corner of Saskatchewan, passing north of Lake Winnipeg, through the tario to Moose Factory, on James's Bay, through northern Quebec to Chicoutimi, with extensions to Montreal and Quebec, and branches to Winnipeg and Toronto. Many of these names are strange to our people now, but they are likely to become familiar before the century gets old.

For the information of any who may desire to take part in the above insurance movement the directors herewith publish a synopsis of the system.

Every person insuring with the association shall become a member thereof and shall agree to pay his proportionate part of all loss and expense which may be liable to accrue, to the association during his membership to such extent as agreed upon, and may withdraw at any time by giving six days notice.

If any member shall refuse or neglect to pay the sum assessed upon him as his portion of loss and expense after thirty days notice the association may collect the same by legal process. The association shall not be liable for loss or damage sustained by any member whose assessment as aforesaid remains unpaid after said thirty days and said non-liability shall continue until all such assessments due are paid or collected. Difference as to loss or damage shall be determined by sworn appraisers chosen by each party and all claims shall be paid in sixty days after settlement.

The affairs of the association shall be conducted by a board of directors chosen at the regular annual meeting of members in the Town of Woodstock each member having one vote only. The operations of the Association shall be confined to the County of Carleton. Further information may be obtained at the secretary's office, Payson's building, Main street.
