Let us Learn the Source of the Campaign Fund.

"Congressman Bourke has," says the Springfield Republican, "pledged himself to bring forward a bill within 48 hours of the assembling of Congress, providing for the creation of a non-partisan commission whose duty shall be to inquire into the sources of the national campaign funds obtained by the two great parties, and report its findings. The campaign fund, contributed by powerful corporations, constitutes the greatest menace that confronts popular government in America. Publicity would go far towards the removal of the danger.

The Liquor Question.

That liquor is the source of lamentable excesses, and that the trade needs to be placed under special safeguards and restrictions, is admitted on all hands, though Canada is a temperate country. As to the particular mode of dealing with the danger, there is, as everyone not blinded by fanaticism must see, a difference of opinion among reformers, all of whom are equally sincere in their aim. Our new Governor-General, who has devoted himself to this subject, is in favor of a special regulation of the traffic in an article, the taste for which, being co-eval and co-extensive with humanity, he believes it to be impossible by the fiat of any Legislature at once to extinguish. But there is one thing in which all men of sense and right feeling, Prohibitionists as well as opponents of Prohibition, must be agreed. They must all abhor the thought of turning a movement of moral reform into a card on the gambling table of political intrigue.—Dr. Goldwin Smith.

Demand for Human Hair.

The largest dealers in human hair in New York, who practically supply the hair crop for the entire United States, are authority for the statement that the demand for this commodity was never as great as it is at present. The result is that the price of all shades and styles of human hair is rapidly soaring upward. There has been an advance in the price of first-class hair of from 30 to 50 per cent. within the last three months. The present indications are, judging from the size of the crop now being imported, that there will be a still further advance in prices during the winter months. One dealer said that it is almost impossible to supply the demand for first-class gray hair. A wig of gray human hair of fine quality is worth its weight in silver, or perhaps even in gold.—Boston Transcript.
