





William Redmond, M. P., once arose to speak in the House of Commons, according to The Boston Evening R cord, and there came a question, hurled at him from the Right side of the House:


"Will you vote for this bill if it comes up?" Mr. Redmond looked from one side of the House to the other and slowly answered: "I will\_"
