### National Records and the Canadian National Live Stock Association Organized.

The efforts made by the leading stockmen of Canada, with the encouragement of the Dominion Minister of Agriculture, for a National system of recording pure bred live stock were successfully culminated at Ottawa last week, when leading stock-breeders from throughout Canada representing various breeds signed agreements with the Minister of Agriculture for the co operation of his department and appointed a National Record Committee to take the responsibility of managing matters of common interest to the various Record Societies. As a result of the agreements, the Minister undertakes that the seal of his Department shall be attached to all certificates of registration when approved by an officer appointed by him.

The following were elected as the Executive Committee:—Chairman, R. Miller, Stouffville, Ont.; Robert Beith, Bowmanville; Wm. Smith, Columbus; A. W. Smith, Maple Lodge; J. E. Brethour, Burford; John Dryden, Toronto and R. Ness, Howick, Que.; A. P. Westervelt, Toronto, was appointed secretary.

The Record Society representatives with delegates from the various provinces met and adopted a constitution forming the Canadian National Live Stock Association. A membership representative of the different provinces and of the larger exhibitions and a representative Board of Directors is provided for. The following officers and directors were elected:—President, John Dryden, Toronto; Vice-Pres. R. Ness, Howick, Que.; Executive Committee, Col. J. A. McGillivray, Toronto; G. A. Gigault, Quebec; Arthur Johnston, Greenwood; Sec'y-treasurer, A. P. Westervelt, Toronto. These with the following form the Board of Directors:—W. W. Ballantyne, Stratford, Ont; Nap. LaChapelle, St. Paul, Hermite, Que.; Andrew Graham, Pomeroy, Man.; T. A. Peters, Fredericton, N. B.; Prof. M. C. Cumming, Truro, N. S.; F. L. Hazzard, Charlottetown, P. E. I.; A. G. Mitch, Lumsden, Assa.; P. Talbot, M. P., Strathcona, Alta.; J. R. Anderson, Victoria, B. C.; and the secretaries of the various provincial live stock associations. A. P. Westervelt was appointed secretary.

### Canadian Apple Growers Combine.

An Associated Press despatch from London to the Toronto News reads as follows:—

Covent Garden salesmen are somewhat discomfited by the news of a combine amongst Canadian apple exporters, which will commence operations this coming season. It is proposed to send this year 150,000 barrels, with an increase to 250,000 the following year if this is found to be satisfactory. But the most surprising part of the affair, says "Expert," writing for The Scotsman, is that none of these enormous parcels

are to be sold on commission. They will be offered outright, at a price to be fixed, so that the aim of the combine is to effect a revolution in the system of distribution.

### PREDICT FAILURE OF COMBINE.

The whole movement is attracting an extraordinary amount of attention in the fruit producing and distributing centres. Covent Garden dealers predict the failure of the movement. They consider it an attempt to interfere with the settled systems of distribution and a serious blow will be struck at the market commission system. Already a market combine to check the effect of that of the Canadian shippers is talked of. Several large distributing firms throughout the country, too, oppose the attempt of the Canadian combine to disorganize the system to dispose of the fruit at present utilized by wholesale commission firms.

### CAN EAT CANADIAN APPLES NOW.

It is thought that the action of the combine will cause an abundance of Canadian apples in every town throughout the British Isles. Thus English fruit growers fear the demand for home fruit will fall off. The action of the Canadian fruit growers is due to American competition, which last year practically monopolized the business of the trading English cities.

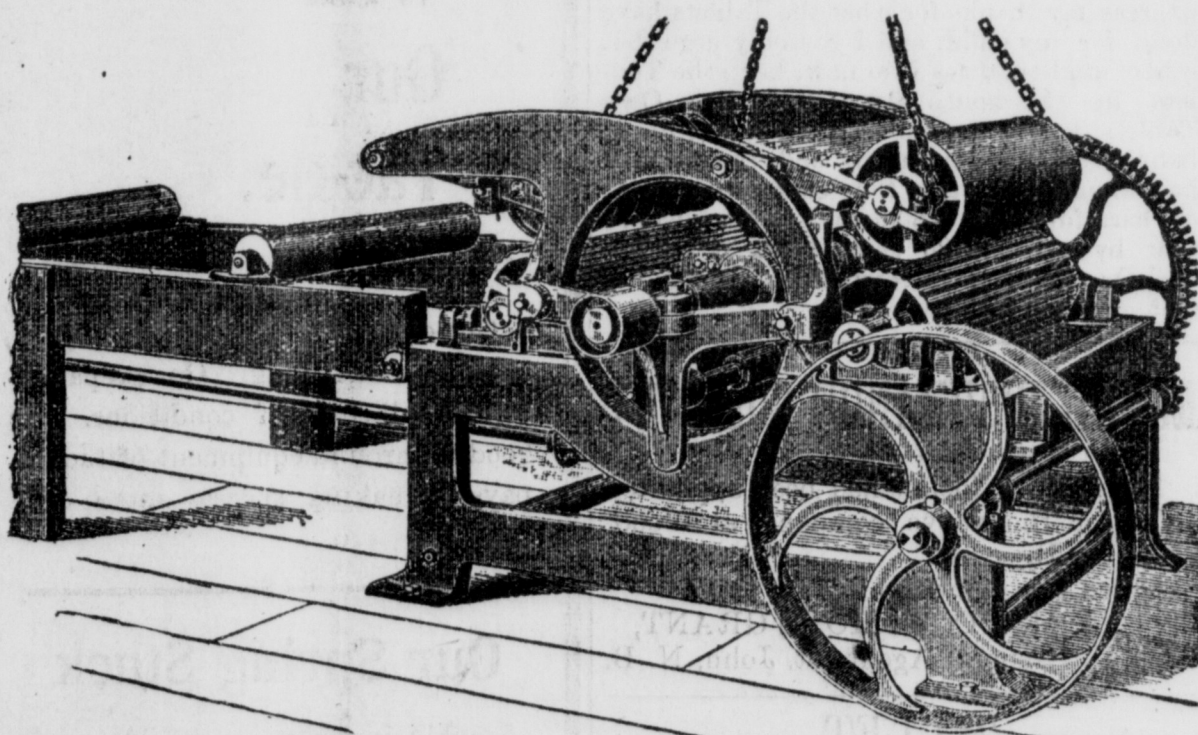

Two more volumes of appendices to the report of the British Royal Commission on Coal Supplies have been issued. In one of them Bennett H. Brough cites an estimate of the coal area of the world still unworked as made by M. E. Loz in 1901, the result of the latter's calculations being as follows:
