

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

The Home Barkeep's Guide.

It is the first duty of the Home Barkeep, every morning, to set the medicine cupboard to rights, with the various bottles of sarsaparilla, liver tonics, soothing syrups and vegetable compounds in plan view. He should then wash and polish his glasses, fill the sugar bowl, peel the lemons and slice the fruit. This done the kitchen blinds should be raised, that the village constable may have an unobstructed view.
