

## Paul Laurence Dunbar.

Paul Laurence Dunbar, negro poet and author, died at Dayton, O., last week. He was born at Dayton, O., in June, 1872, and was a full-blooded negro. Both of his parents had been slaves in the South before the civil war. They sent him to the public schools as soon as he was old enough, and he learned rapidly. He went through the high school, and then began to aid in the support of his widowed mother. A position as elevator boy was procured for him in one of the municipal buildings, and it was while thus engaged that he began to write. His first contributions were to local newspapers, and after awhile he was encouraged to send some of his work to the magazines.

It was not known that the author of verses accepted by the editors was a negro, until Dodd, Mead & Co. published a book for him. On the receipt of \$400 from his publishers, he gave up his position in Dayton and decided to take a trip to Europe. His native city, proud of the distinction of producing such a talented member of the race, voted him a sum of money.

In England, where a man's colored is no bar to social recognition, he was received by many of the best people. His recitations and lectures paid him well, and he returned to this country in a position to earn a good income.

Howells said of him:—"As far as I could remember, Paul Laurence Dunbar, was (or is), the only man of pure African blood and of American civilization to feel the negro life aesthetically and express it lyrically."

Mr. Dunbar accepted a position in the Congressional Library at Washington a few years ago. He married Alice Ruth Moore in 1898, when she was a school teacher in Brooklyn.

Slightly stooped, his hair silvered but with few other tokens of advancing years, the southern evangelist has yet the picturesque style and fund of humor which have amused and instructed tens of thousands for a generation. Mr. Jones who is properly described as Rev. Samuel P. Jones, had some things to say of Toronto, but his general remarks pertained to a wide range of subjects. Here are some of his sayings:—

"You talk about closing the saloons out of this town and the saloon merchants is afraid it will injure his trade, the little doctor is afraid he will lose his patients, the little banker is afraid he will lose a depositor, and that's the way the world goes today. I believe if we had the courage to do and dare for that which is right we could run the devil out of the country. You try to run the devil out of Toronto like I saw a dog running a hog once; the dog was in front."

"There is not a more irreligious thing in the world than religion."

"You get the Bible out of your heart and you get the devil in. It is the devil in folks that makes them bad. I have seen the devil get into a man and he wanted to fight everything. I have seen him get into a woman and I never stayed to see what followed."

"God pity the little woman who has struck a man as cold as a dog's nose. I expect some of you old fellows have not kissed your wife this year. I believe in a man loving his wife and telling her he loves her."

"We will never get rid of drunkards, liars and rascals in this country until you quit raising them."

"I told my boys they could tell lies, get drunk or steal, but they should never smoke cigarettes."

"A man that will drink whiskey and bring up his boy to be a drunkard is a plain fool."

"In nearly all the States of the Union I have bragged of Toronto as the cleanest, most moral city on the earth, but now you have retrograded and are just like Buffalo. You had no cars moving nor papers sold, but now you have everything going on Sunday. If you had kept on clean you would not have had to die to go to heaven. God Almighty would just have extended the streets of the new Jerusalem down here to connect with yours."

"I believe my mother has just as much right in a saloon as I have; my wife has as much right in a gambling house as I have; my daughter has just as much right in a shameless house as I have."

"I believe the United States has more fun than Canada has; our preachers are not as solemn as your preachers are. I was solemn myself once, but I went to a doctor about it. When he got through with me I was well. I never had it but once. He called it a diseased liver."

"God Almighty never made anything that looking at it would make you cry, but He made a thousand things to make us laugh."

"I have watched two puppies playing in the yard, and their antics would make anybody laugh but a Toronto preacher."

## New C. P. Stock Issue.

The Canadian Pacific is to issue a new block of stock—forty millions' worth of it. The stock today is worth over 170. The new stock will be issued at par to present stockholders. A hundred-dollar share will bring in a hundred dollars from the shareholder; if issued to the public on the open market it would bring in 160 at least. Instead of getting in forty millions of capital, the company would obtain over sixty millions, and sixty millions will build half as much more track and improvements as forty millions will build.

But the road, the traffic, will have to pay as much dividend on the forty millions got from the shareholders as it would on sixty millions got from a new public.

Isn't it a beautiful watermelon that is going to be cut for the shareholders at the expense of the people, whose traffic goes over the line? O, wise directors! O, lucky shareholders! O, impotent elector!

## Teachers' Salaries.

Omaha's Board of Education has increased the pay of teachers in that city's schools from a minimum of \$380 a year to \$420, and from a maximum of \$760 to \$830. The new schedule will go into effect in September. It will be possible, therefore, after having served eight years, and passed a satisfactory examination, for a bright Omaha teachers to earn nearly as much as the driver of a brewery wagon. In their petition for an increase, the teachers suggested a minimum of \$500 and a maximum of \$1,000, but the board hesitated to enrich the petitioners in any rash way. Probably the Omaha board wished to train its schoolma'ams up to the use of wealth gradually. If this movement toward the increase in pay for teachers keeps on spreading, the "little red schoolhouse" will go perforce. No community of farmers that we ever heard of will think of paying the young woman who guides their children's minds as much in a year as a good span of horses would cost; and in that instinct for economy the country is not much ahead of the cities.
