I. C. R. Bookkeeping.

The Moncton Transcript, referring to the
published statement that the system of
bookkeeping on the I. C. R. is to be changed
and the system used on the Pennsylvania
Railway instituted, says the refer goes fur-
ther than is indicated in the despatches.
The new system of bookkeeping and auditing
to be adopted is made obligatory on all rail-
ways in the United States under the inter-
state commission regulations. Under the
new arrangement it will be possible to obtain
a statement weekly of the operations of the
I. C. R.; hitherto, according to the Trans-
cript, a statement for a given month could
not be obtained until the second month
afterwards. Two expert accountants have
been looking over the books at Moncton,
and they are soon to formally instal the new
system. It is evident from the economies
practiced and the reforms decided upon or
under consideration that Hon. Mr. Emmer-
son is seeking to place the government rail-
way on more of a business basis than has
yet been attempted. It is to be hoped that
his efforts will be crowned with success.—The
Globe.

Jack London's Wild Harangue.

It is no news to hear that Jack London is
a Socialist, and that, too, of an advanced
type. But few of those who have read with
pleasure his vivid and forceful novels would
believe that he would indulge in talk so wild
and dangerous as that which he uttered be-
fore an audience of Yale students a few days
ago; and if anything is more astonishing than
than his talk of "blood-red banner," it is
the fact that it was delivered before an audi-
ence of three thousand young men in one of
the greatest of American universities. Here
is the report of the affair as it appeared in
the columns of an American newspaper:—
Jack London last night made a socialistic
speech before an audience of 3,000 Yale men
and their friends in Woolsey Hall, the great
Yale amphitheatre. London's views were so
radical that they even exceeded the fears of
the Yale faculty, who only recently consented
to London's appearance before a student
audience. In an address on "The Coming
Crisis" he predicted a great social revolution.
He said in part: "When I write to a Social-
ist I start the letter with the phrase 'Dear
Comrade' and close the letter with the phrase
'Yours For the Revolution.' That is the
practice among 400,000 Socialists in the
United States.

"There are throughout the world 700,000
Socialists organized in a great international
movement. Their purposes are the destruc-
tion of society, the doing away with the
ownership of capital and with patriotism; in
brief, the overthrow of existing society. We

will content with nothing less than all power;
with the possession of the whole world we
Socialists will wrest the power from the
present rulers by war, if necessary. Stop us
if you can.

"Socialism is going shoulder to shoulder
with the work of civilization. It has spread
even into Cuba and the Philippines. The
grip of socialism is tightening on the world.
The blood red banner will soon be waving
wildly in all winds. This is not a vague up-
rising. The propaganda is based on intelli-
gence and on economic necessity. The work-
ers as a class are fighting the capitalists as a
class.

"My indictment against capital has never
been answered. I challenge any capitalist to
answer it. Capital has managed society and
failed utterly, because of its blindness and
greed. To it is due that chronic starvation
for generations, which has in certain sections
of England resulted in social deterioration.
When the food-getting efficiency of the mod-
ern man is so great, why is it that 10,000
people are this night starving to death in
this land? Why is it that 50,000 children in
New York City go to school without break-
fast each morning? Yet there are 1,320
millionaires in New York City. The capital-
ists are in the minority, we are in the maj-
ority. All capitalists are bad and all work-
ingmen are good. If people object to our
programme because of the constitution then
to h—l with the constitution. Yes, to
hell with the constitution. President Roose-
velt is frightened by our revolution. He
says that class war is the greatest danger to
the country. Class war is our watchword."

Hazel Eyes the Weakest.

"This case of glass eyes tells me, for one
thing. Look these glass eyes over. Don't
you see how hazel predominates among
them?"

It was true. Among 100 glass eyes forty-

gray and black. "There are, you see, four
times as many hazel eyes as blue ones, blown
ones, black ones, and so on," said the ocul-

prettiest eye, but let us thank our stars that
it has been denied to you and me."

The whipping-post law, for the benefit of
wife-beaters, has been enacted in Oregon.
The maximum penalty is 20 lashes, and it is
optional with the court whether convicted
wife-beaters shall be sentenced to the whip-
ping post or confined in jail. There have
been only three inflections of the penalty
since the law was enacted. A month after
the law went into effect a Portland waiter
was arrested for beating his wife. He was
sentenced to receive twenty lashes. He was
taken to the Multnomah county jail the
upper part of his body was bared, and his
hands were handcuffed together and tied to
the top of a cell door. Then the jailer
struck him twenty times. The whip used
was a short cowhide stock with four buck-
skin thongs. This made every lash really
four blows on the body.

The whipping, the first of its kind in the
West, attracted wide attention, and it made
troublesome husbands fearful. The man
whipped left Portland as soon as he was at
liberty.



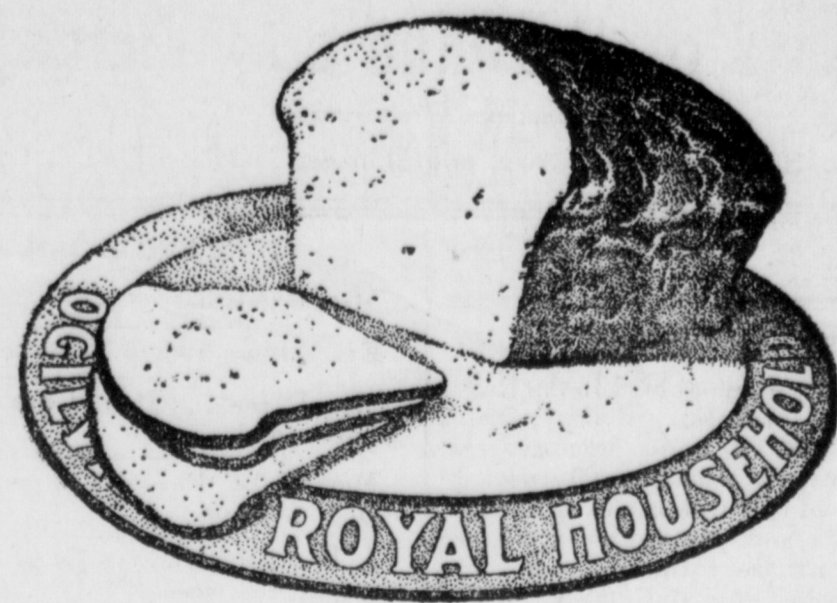

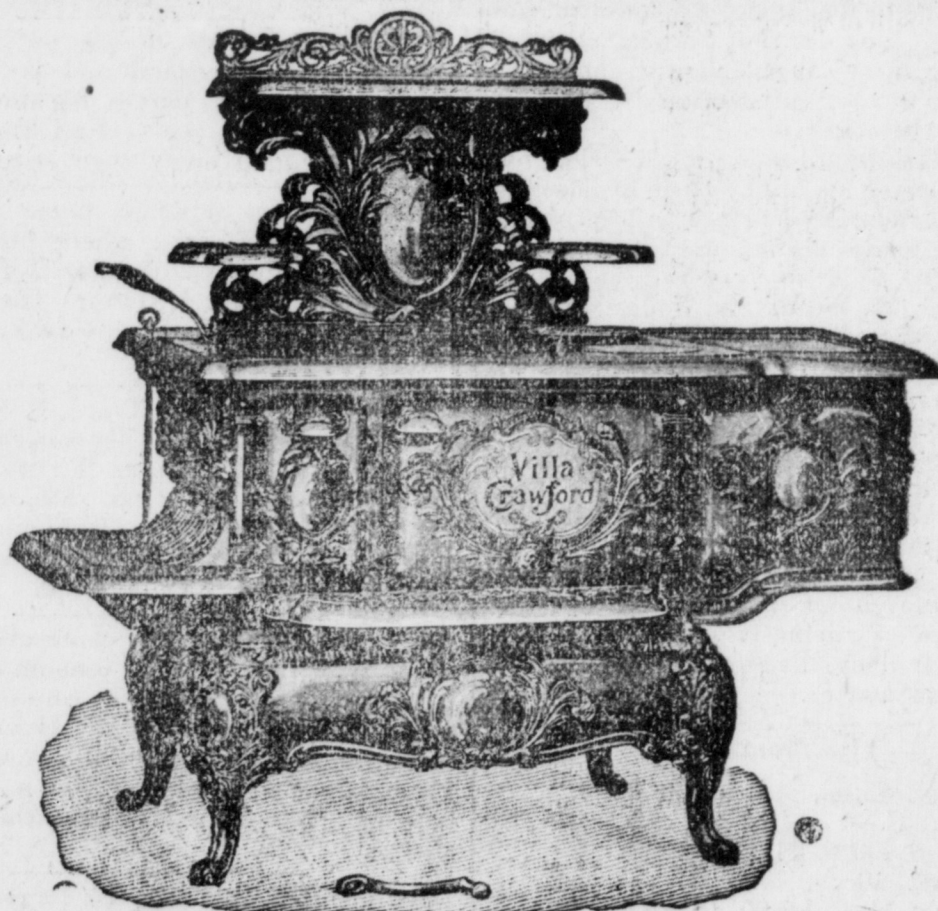
