The opium traffic in Australia has received States agreed to forbid the sale and growth of Ozone (the coupon kind.) of the drug, and now the Commonwealth Government has prohibited the importation of opium except for medicinal purposes. The Chinese are the chief customers for the drug in that part of the world, and in one or two or the large cities there used to be found "opium dens," which were as vile resorts as could be found anywhere. The resorts as could be found anywhere. The consumption of opium was considerable. The drug is grown locally, but, in addition to what is thus produced, there was imported last year no less a quantity than twentylast year no less a quantity than twentyeight tons. Australians have long- been fully awake to the havor the drug was causing, and this change in the law, following so soon upon the ordinance enacted in the Transvaal, is somewhat of a triumph for the Anti-Opium Society. the Merchant Marine Commission in charge Senate, a remarkable report, showing the in fliciency of the United States army transport service in time of war. The report declares that a fleet necessary to transport even the present limited military resources on an oversea expedition could not be furnished out of the present resources of the merchant marine of the United States. In order to bring about efficiency it would be necessary to increase the sea-going merchant marine to approximately two and a half times its present tonnage. The Santiago expedition of 1898 is freely criticized, and it is averred that its success was due to the good fortune of continued fair weather.

M. Camille Flammarion has been making some experiments at the station for climatologic agriculture of Juvisy, in the suburbs of Paris, to see whether the moon exerts any influence upon the growth of plants according to the popular opinion. He made different sets of plantings at dates which corresponded to the different phases of the moon, using peas, beets, carrots, potatoes, beans, and many other vegetables of the ordinary kinds. After some experimenting he found that the results which were observed on the growth of the plants were extremely variable and no fixed rule seemed to govern them. The plants appeared at periods which had no connection with the moon's phases, so that it was impossible to draw any definite conclusions from the first series of experiment. M. Flammarion is to continue his observations on this subject and sooner or later will no doubt have results which will decide this much-disputed point.-Scientific WOODSTOCK, N. B., FEB. 7, 1906.


