A Chinese Sportsman.

The dress of a Chinese sportsman is as primitive as his gun. Usually a pair of straw sandals and the poorest of clothes are all that are worn. I could not see that the sandals were any protection against the scrub oak briars which grow on the hillsides, but there was a lightness and noiselessness in the step which showed that the heavy boot of the forger would not suit him so well. The clothes were no protection against the chilly winds that swept the low-lying plains between the hills and the shores of the river. A Chinaman seldom shoots over a dog. Occasionally a sportsman of the higher class will be accompanied with beaters, but oftenest his noiseless step and quick eye find the game and bag it. When I was a boy it was the habit to sight the gun with one eye closed, but now the fashion is to keep both eyes on the bird and let the gun follow the eyes. This fashion was long known to the Chinese sportsman before the westerner knew there was such an instrument as a gun. Sometimes a Chinese sportsman, simply presses the breech of the gun against his side and confides to his hands the office of directing the position of the barrel in accordance with the accuracy of his eyes. I have seen them shoot with the most apparent indifference as to how the gun was held, but at the same time the eyes did not fail, for invariably the snipe or pheasant would fall at the discharge of the gun. The Chinese also knew that hard shot were more suitable for a gun built smaller at the muzzle than at the breech before the process of chilling shot was known in the west. They prefer shot made

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of iron, and will cut nails and pieces of wire into small square slugs and shoot with such in preference to the best grade of chilled shot. The shot of native manufacture are very irregular, and are made of iron. When the iron is melted the liquid metal is poured from a height on to a stone laid in a tub of water, and when cooled the pellets are collected and sorted according to size, but not passed through sieves, as is the foreign custom—a process which causes the pellets to be very irregular in size and shape.

A friend informs me that on one occasion, and at the close of a cold December, he was walking near a lake when he saw a Chinaman who was beckoning to him. As he approached he was asked not to shoot the ducks in the lake, as a Chinese sportsman was in the water, and awaiting to see what would happen, he saw the sportsman approaching the shore wearing a large bamboo collar. He was carrying a basket containing a few wild and three tame ducks, secured together by a string. His dress was of goat-skin, with the wool inside; his stockings were stitched to his clothing, and so oiled to be nearly waterproof, and thus accoutred he immersed his body, using the cangue as a float. On his hat were placed bunches of grass, and on the cangue two or three decoy ducks. He would then approach the wild fowl, and when near enough dexterously catch the unsuspecting duck by the leg and drag it under the water. My friend informed me that he watched the sportsman until he had filled his basket.—Forest and Stream.

Cut Out Half the Trees.

Many and many an orchard all over the country fails to produce the most fruit and of the best quality, by reason of being planted too thickly. Look at a fullgrown Baldwin apple tree planted out by itself. If in congenial soil it is from forty to sixty, and sometimes even more, feet in diameter, and from twenty to fifty feet high, its leaves thick and rugose, and loaded with apples of fine color. Turn and look at that Baldwin orchard across the way, in as good soil and of the same age, but planted even thirty feet apart. Here the trees are equally as tall, but tops matted together so no sunlight ever reaches the ground. Most of the lower limbs are dead, and what apples there are are mostly on upper limbs, and what happen to be on lower part of top are pale in color, and of very poor quality. Apples cannot grow without sunshine, and it must shine not only all over the trees, but should reach the ground all about as well. If this man's trees are twenty feet apart, and he cuts out half of them diagonally they will still be only a little over twenty-eight feet apart; if twenty-four feet and he cuts half there will be not quite thirty-four feet. But very much depends upon the soil. On some soils thirty-four feet will do very well, but on other soils forty feet would be much better. We had an orchard twenty-four feet apart, and we cut out half the trees and got more apples and of better quality, and after a few years we cut out another half leaving them forty-eight feet, and still got more and better apples than before. I would surely cut out a half, and maybe three-fourths of the trees depending on soil.—J. S. Woodward in Rural New Yorker.

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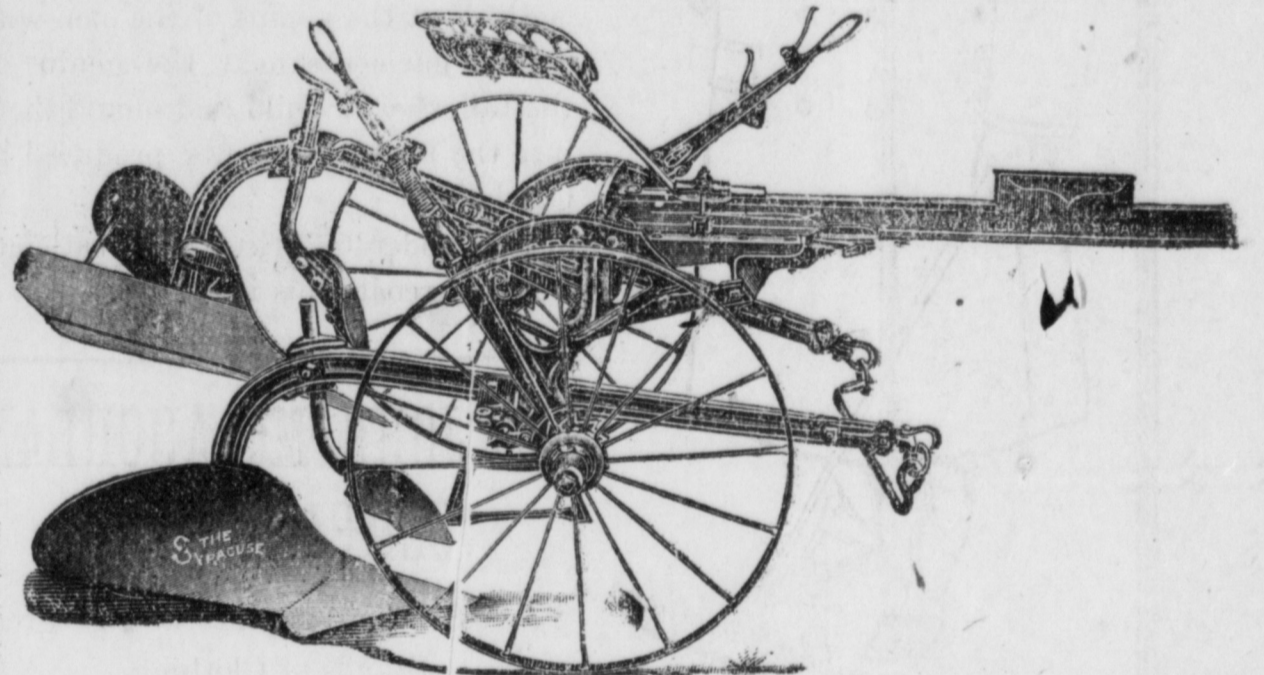
