Australia's Prosperity.

(Toronto News.)

Australia has just completed its first quinquennium under federation, and, according to the Sydney correspondent of the London Morning Post, the figures of the public accounts are very satisfactory. These show sound trade, abundance of money, increase of savings, large returns upon all investments, a growth of land settlement and a general growth of population. South Australia, which apprehended a deficit, has the largest balance at its credit the State has ever known. Queenland shows a surplus of £127,000, Victoria of £600,000, and New South Wales of £930,000, while the Commonwealth, after paying over three-fourths of its customs revenue to the States in the discharge of its constitutional obligations, has distributed among them its own surplus of £827,000 which is £358,000 more than was expected. Splendid rains have visited the pastoral and agricultural areas, there is a general mining revival, high prices for wool, a natural growth of export trade facilities, and an enlarged output of manufactures.. It is pointed out that these results have not been purchased by fresh burdens upon the taxpayers, and indeed are in no way exceptional. The railways and other business undertakings, built with borrowed money, not only paid interest upon all sums expended thereon, but within £200,000 of the total interest upon public buildings, bridges, harbor works and other undertakings not directly reproductive.



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

Preservation of Timber. (From the Hartford Times.)

Telehone poles nearly always decay at or just below the ground line. The upper portion of the pole, permanently in the air, rapidly drying after rain, is practically always dry and is rarely found dscayed. The butt of the pole, deeply buried in the ground, is in a permanently damp condition, but oxygen being excluded it is seldom badly affected. Close to the ground line the soil retains the moisture and keeps the woods constantly damp where it is exposed to the air and to the heat of the sun, which is just what its little vegetable enemies like; bat if the albumen in the wood can be rendered unfit for food the wood tissues offer practically no support to fungi. Timber preservation amounts, then, to poisoning the food sapply of the destructive agencies.

Preservation of timber is attempted in three ways-by seasoning, either natural or artificial; by outward mechanical means, such as charring in fire or the applications of antiseptics on the surface of the stock, and by impregnating the wood with antiseptics. Of these the last is by far the most important. The most perfect method-which is also the most expensive-is the injection of dead oil or coal tar into the whole fibre of the pole.
