#### Household Hints.

Useful hints to housekeepers are the fol lowing: To clean a clock lay in the bottom a rag saturated with kerosene oil. The fumes will loosen the dirt, and it will drop out. In a few days remove and place another saturated rag in the clock, the fumes of which will lubricate the works.

A small, stiff brush should be used for cleaning all vegetables that grow under ground. It will remove the dirt which often stains the hands.

Another useful brush for use in the kitchen is a small soft varnish one for brushing biscuits, bread, rolls, and pastry shells with melted butter.

Fresh green vegetables will retain their bright color best if cooked uncovered. The steam confined beneath the cover of the kettle deadens any fresh coloring.

Spinach will be much improved in color f it is quickly boiled in salted water until nearly tender, then drained and dropped into cold water until chilled. It should then be thoroughly drained, after which it is ready for use.

Never use a whole egg to clear your coffee. If it is properly made from cold water, and allowed to stand a few moments after it boils it is sufficiently cleared without egg. Some housekeepers, however, think that egg gives richness to the coffee.

A prominent tobacco importer of this city was asked the other day whether there was anything extraordinary in the gift of \$2.65 cigars sent to King Fdward VII. by Baron Rothschild. The baron it appears, is accustomed to send to the British ruler a box of these expensive "smokes" once in every

"That's not a record price by any means," replied the importer.

He produced a box of enormous cigars, rich brown in color, with fancy red bands around them. These, he said retailed for \$4

"You can get them as high as \$5." he added. "Look at the Havana price list, here. You see this one? It costs wholesale, without duty, \$1.50. "The only time anybody buys such a thing is when he wishes to give it away or to use it for some specially elaborate dinner. For instance, the other day, a Wall Street speculator had a birthday, and several of his friends came to me and bought these \$4 cigars to send to him. Each friend bought only one. We wrapped up the sigars in fancy paper and pot them in ornate, gilt lettered boxes for shipment to the speculator. I remember, too a dinner given by a Broker, at which a dozen of the cigars were distributed by the bost.

"The guests at that dinner were in hard luck. I know, for I saw the effects of a \$4 smoke on one of my friends. I gave him one of the cigars and watched him burn it ap. The feat required about two hours, and when he was through, he told me he felt like a wreck. He said he'd stop smoking altogether if he had to use that sort of a cigar regularly. No, it wasn't the strength-the high priced ones usually are rather mild; it was the time consumed in continuously puffing away at the thing. Ordinarily even the most inveterate smoker takes a rest between cigars. In this case there was no chance of stopping, unless he wished to miss part of the treat."

The \$4 cigar is about eight or nine inches long and proportionately builty. According to the dealer, its value depends principally upon the length of the toleacco leaf from which it has been rolled.

"Of course," he said, "the tobacco is of the best quality, but quality in small leaves is plentiful. The difficulty is to find a leaf of the size required and of the proper quality at the same time. I should say that the leaf for this sigar measured about two feet.

"All the finest cigars come from Cuba. We could get long leaves up in Connecticut, but they wouldn't be good enough. I've no doubt that there is much tobacco of big sizes in the East Indies, but there is no country that rivals Cuba in the quality of its tobacco crop: Undoubtedly the Rothschild gift to King Edward came from there."

Theidentally he told of high-priced cigarettes. The most costly, he explained, was a domestic variety that sold for \$100 a thousand; or ten cents apiece. There was no

imported eigarette costing so much, he said. "The \$200-a-thousand sort," ha-explained, "does not bring that price because of intrinsic quality, but largely because offthe fancy bozzin which they are packed. They are larger in size than the average, but not even an expert sould detect a superiority in qualit wover many a cigarette costing less than halftas much."
