County Council.

Upper Woodstock
June 18th, 1907.

County Council met at 10 a m in the Court House. Warden D H Lamont in the chair. The councillors were all present except Coun Fewer who was unavoidably absent through business.

A letter was read from J C Hartley sec-treas requesting his inability to attend the session owing to illness through a very sore eye, and asking to be excused. On motion of Coun Carvell, the sec-treas was excused from attendance during this session.

Mr J P Malaney read the minutes of the previous session. Minutes were confirmed on motion.

On motion of Coun Williams seconded by Coun Kinney, Mr D McLeod Vince was heard with respect to the road money collected and expended under the Highway Act. He explained this was the amount collected during 1905 and 1906 until the 18th day of February.

Coun Melville wanted to know what the county had to do with this money which was really in the hands of the Provincial Government.

Mr Vince said it was the law that the county auditor should make the audit. Following is report.

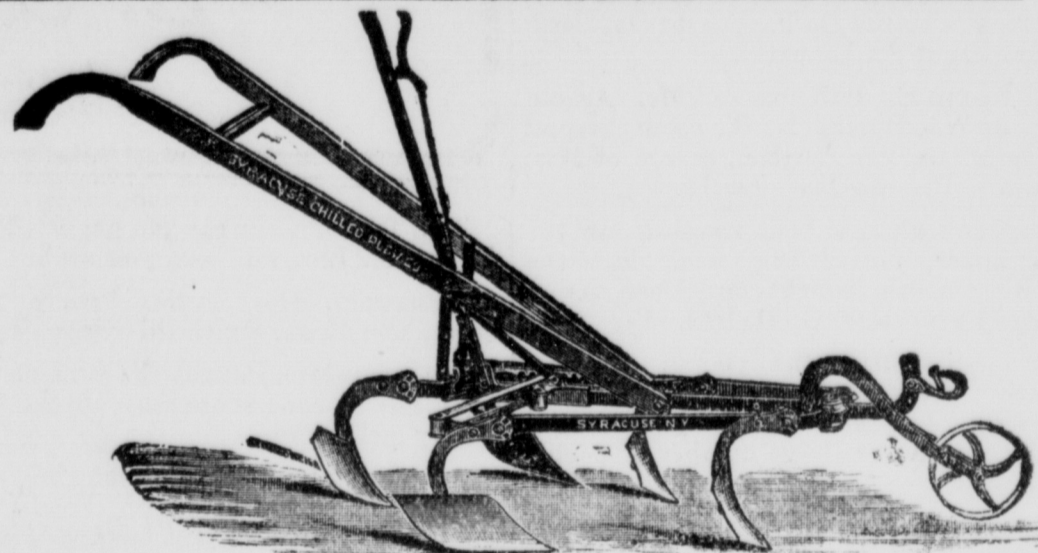
