To Prevent The Spread of Consumption.

A large number of the most prominent manufacturers of Rhode Island, including the heads of the largest machine shops, wotton mills and cotton factories, have banded together in a united effort to prevent the spread of consumption among their operatives. Rhode Island is a great manufacturing State, and its important cities and towns contain a closely-crowded population. The result, as shown by the latest figures, is that consumption carries off more than twice as many victims as all other preventable and communicable diseases combined. The newly formed league of millmen employes sanitary engineers and physicians who make constant inspections and watch each employe for signs of tuberculosis. Assistance and proper attention are provided for those who have the disease, and a campaign of education is conducted among all the operatives. House-to-house inspection of tenement districts, careful records of the removal and whereabouts of families in which the disease is present or has appeared, and the formation of a committee on legislation are other steps which the millmen have taken. They are mentioned here because they are within the capacity of large employers of labor everywhere, and are not only humane but "good business."—Youth's Companion.

The Gambling Evil in Sydney.

The Australian correspondent of the London Morning Post writes: The gambling evil in Sydney and Melbourne had reached a stage which demanded drastic measures. The main streets of Sydney were thickly dotted with betting clubs and shops, which the law was formerly unable to control. Almost in the heart of Melbourne the famous "Colingwood Tote" carried on a flourishing unlawful business, and that, too, under the very eyes of the police. The most skilled detectives found it next to impossible to gain access to the premises, which were fortified against surprise and provided with numerous means of escape. It became manifestly impossible to secure the conviction of the conductors. Places of this kind have been absolutely suppressed, both in Melbourne and Sydney, by enactments which empower the Supreme Court, on the affidavit of a police official showing reasonable grounds, to declare such premises common gaming houses. After such a declaration any person found in the "quarantined" premises, or entering or leaving them, or even any building which is used

as a means of access to them, may be immediately arrested, and unless he can prove that he was there for a lawful purpose he becomes liable to six months imprisonment. An owner who knowingly allows his premises to be used for gaming, or as a means of access to a gaming house, is subjected to a very heavy penalty. If he discovers that they are being used for such a purpose he is not only entitled but is bound to determine the lease. These enactments have produced their object far more quickly and effectively than is generally the case with measures of social reform. They were not intended to eradicate the gambling instinct. Some agency other than legislation must do that. But they were intended to restrict the temptations of the young and to limit the opportunities of the hardened gambler. This they have done to a very large extent. So far as one can discover every betting place of any size in Sydney and Melbourne has been closed. The considerable numbers of people who made a living out of them have had to seek either new occupations or new fields for their old occupation.

Timely Hints for the Housewife.

When administering the weekly sweeping to carpets and rugs much annoyance with arising dust would be saved if wet tea leaves were thrown over the floor a few minutes before beginning work. Some housekeepers use damp corn meal, which is very good, but the tea leaves answer the same purpose and cost nothing; and they leave a faint, delicate odor in the room for several hours after it has been put to rights.

Now that the fruit season is at its height and thrifty housewives are storing up sweetmeats for the coming winter, housefurnishing departments in all the big shops are making special offers in the way of earthen ware preserving kettles in which acid fruits are best cooked, fruit jars, jelly glasses, ladles, fruit parers, etc. At this same counter one finds the white paraffine which affords the most effective means of sealing fruit and preventing mould.

A very new and useful article in house furnishings is the cake and toast scraper. It is made of metal and wood and designed for scraping the burnt portions from toast, bread and cake. In the absence of such a convenience we have long been accustomed to make use of the knife for such a purpose, but now that this new invention has been brought out, it will, doubtless, find a very ready sale at the very small price which is asked for it.

Young housewives might profit much if they would not follow many of the ways of the old fashioned housewife. For instance, if they would wrap laces not in use in blue paper instead of white they would find that when the wrappings were removed the fine fabric would be of as pure whiteness as when it first left the store. Again, if summer wash clothes were put away rough dry and without starch they would not turn yellow and would wear twice as long. Starch rots a fabric when it lays long and more especially after it has been ironed.

Just now when the moth millers are about and making all sorts of trouble in their small way, owners of feather boas, ostrich and marabout, those attractive neck dressings which have become such fashionable accessories to the present day toilette, should have a care lest these small destroyers get into the soft fluffiness of the feathers and utterly ruin them. Feather boas and scarfs should never be left hanging around like other garments of the feminine wardrobe, but should be carefully boxed when not in use. The offensive camphor balls are quite impossible as a preventive against these little pests, but cedar chips which one may purchase at any chemist's shop may be used without any disagreeable results.
