**Bedrooms Without Beds.**  
(From Popular Mechanics.)

A new era in flat construction, in which  
bedroomless apartments made possible by the  
introduction of sanitary disappearing wall  
beds, is the feature about to be launched  
upon its journey of popular acclaim or defeat  
by a firm of Western flat-builders. It is  
claimed that flat buildings thus constructed  
will make two and three room suites serve  
the purpose of the old four or five room  
apartments.

The bed when not in use is folded into a  
closet or recess, ventilated and lighted by  
window or vent, creating an all-day sanitary  
arrangement. The bedding is securely fas-  
tened at the foot of the bed, and when shut  
away for the day the sheets and comforters  
hang slightly separated, thus affording prop-  
er sanitation. When not in use the orna-  
mental face of the bed presents to the eye a  
large cheval plate mirror and mantelpiece.  
When the bed is down, automatically closing  
doors form an apparently solid wall.

**To Paint Galvanized Iron.**  
To get paint to adhere to galvanized iron  
seems to be a difficult problem and various  
experiments have been made in order to get  
around the difficulty. The United States  
Government has adopted a mode of proce-  
dure which seems to give satisfactory results.  
Specifications call for the use of vinegar in  
washing the surface before painting. This  
roughens or corrodes the surface and gives  
the paint much better adhesion.

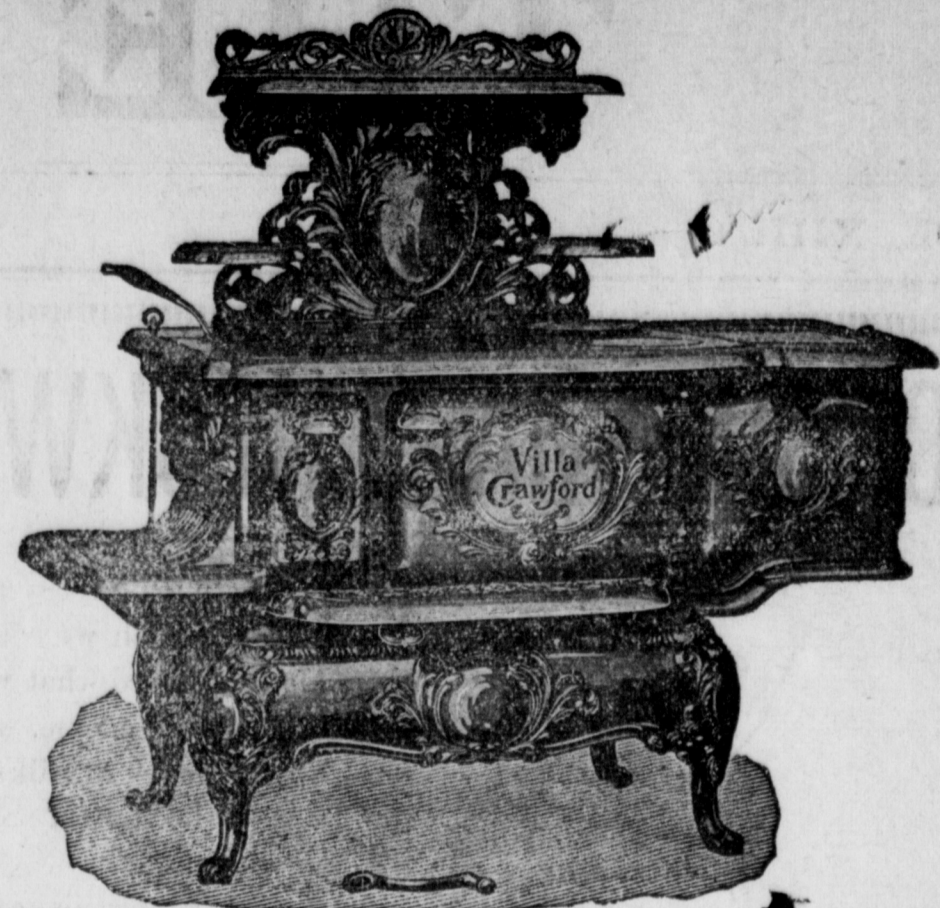

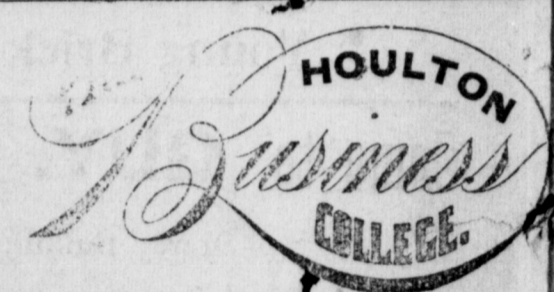
