It was granted after the records of the village had been examined and the man's age verified. Four years later the woman was also granted a pension.

The old couple live in a modest cottage and are well looked after by relatives. They are nearly blind and very deaf, and sleep nearly all of the time. The man, however, still enjoys his pipe and a glass of wine, and neither is bedridden.

It is a strange fact that in all their years they have never left the village and know nothing of the great world outside of Isonbolgi. They were both born there and have lived continuously in wedlock a quiet and peaceful life.

The recent celebration of their hundredth wedding day was participated in by the entire village, which is very proud of having established, without any doubt, a world's record.—Detroit News-Tribune.
