A. O. U. W. In Michigan Surrenders Charter,

After a long and stubborn battle against heavy odds, to place the order in Michigan on a stable footing, the Grand Lodge of Michigan, Ancient Order of United Work. men, on July 9th voted to surrender its charter. In spite of a number of increases in the insurance rates the death claims have accumulated faster than the receipts. It is stated that the Grand Lodge faces an indebtedness of \$160,000, to meet which there are only the June collections and a balance of about \$50,000 which the Grand Lodge has been endeavoring for some time to collect from the Supreme Lodge, the Mational Organ. In eight years the membership in Michigan has decreased from 13,000 to less than 3,000. The Drug Store.

During the seventeenth century the druggist came to America and closely followed English precedents, modifying them, however, by the practice of the Indians, with whom he came in contact. Quack apothecaries began to spring up in the new land, and in 1636 the colony of Virginia passed a law which among other things regulated the prices and fees of the druggist. At this time it was fashionable for the druggists to practice surgery in addition to pharmacy, and the Virginia colony contained a large number of people who were proficient in both professions. In Massachusetts the business was largely in the hands of Indians, schoolmasters, old women and teachers. 


