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





The editors of Woman's Home Companion for whom Jack London is sailing around the world in his little boat Snark, state that he is now over a month due at Tahili of the Society Islands, for which place he sailed from Hilo, Hawaii, on October 27th.

The gas engine with which the Snark is equipped was not working well when Mr. London left Hawaii, and it is supposed by his publishers that he has experienced some more troubles with it, or that he has encountered the doldrums of the Pacific, by which the little forty-five foot boat might be buffeted about for days or weeks, to be dropped at length into a sea dead calm. For such are the equatorial doldrums.

London sailed from San Francisco on May 4th and reached Hawaii about a month later. He is accompanied on his voyage around the world by his wife, a captain, an engineer, one sailor, and two Japanese servants. London expects to spend seven years on his voyage and to sail completely around the world, stopping at interesting places where-
