A Jaunty Street Costume.

A jaunty street costume of dark blue cloth with a self stripe, has a skirt cut circular, gored, and made over a drop skirt of taffeta. This is topped with a knee-length coat, with a vest of the plain cloth braided. The line from the centre back of the neck to the bust line is a direct slant, then from the bust in another direct slant the coat is cut away in a line to the bottom. The under-arm section extends only to a point below the hips, and the front portion and sleeves are finished separately, so that the line of braiding, with that which outlines the coat itself, extends from the shoulders around the arm-side, from the under-arm piece, giving excellent lines to the whole garment. The sleeves are cut on the lines of a plain coat sleeve as far as the elbow, and at that point are slashed at the back, the corners being turned back over a cuff of the cloth, braided in an all-over design.

Canada to Supply Timber to The World
The general increase in the price of wood for the past few years has had the effect of turning public attention to the timber supply in general. To many, the increase in prices is sufficiently explained by saying that there is a combine among lumber producers and manufacturers. But, independent of the possible existence of any combine, a deeper cause underlies the increase in prices and the cause lies in this, that timber is becoming harder and harder for the manufacturer to get. Greater and greater economy and use of materials formerly considered as waste is being introduced into the manufacture of wood, and in spite of all the price

of logs is going up, owing to higher wages that have to be paid, greater distances the logs have to be brought and many other reasons.

Not in America alone is the scarcity of timber being felt; it has become a world-wide question. Only seven countries in the world are now in a position to export timber. In Europe there are five, namely, Austro-Hungary, Norway, Sweden, Finland and Russia; in America there are two, namely, Canada and the United States. But Russia, Austro-Hungary and the United States are increasing their population and developing their industries so fast that they cannot long continue to be exporting countries. The timber of Norway is threatened with excessive cutting. Germany, where the practice of forestry has been brought to the greatest perfection, has never been able to supply home demands, and is a heavy importer.

Canada, Sweden and Finland are left, and their supply is hopelessly deficient for the world. If Canada were to attempt to supply the United States alone, its entire timber area would be cut off and denuded in the course of a very few years—probably less than a decade.

Various estimates of Canada's forest land have been given. Eight hundred million acres was a few years ago accepted as pretty near the truth; but, considering the damage caused by fire and other destructive agencies, it is doubtful if the existing forests cover half that area. To keep this area in its most productive state, thus enabling it to meet the demand as far as possible and to produce the largest revenue, is the problem set those in control of these areas, and the protection of the forests against fire and other dangers and their proper management under forestry methods is the only way in which this can be effected.

Bad Language Uncivilized

In a recent issue of Harper's Monthly Magazine Dr. Lounsbury, professor of English in Yale University, discussed "The coming and going of Expletives," in which he has a passage that all men would do well to consider: "It is not until men have reached a high degree of cultivation that they begin to appreciate the efficacy of understatement. To a very great extent the practice of swearing is specially characteristic of a rude and imperfect civilization. With the advance of culture profanity declines. It declines not so much because men become peculiarly sensitive to its viciousness, but they do to its ineffectiveness." He thinks the practice has been "steadily, even if slowly diminishing for centuries. The growth of refinement, both in the individual and in the community, tend more to its disuse than all the exhortations of moralists or the rebukes of divines." It will be remembered that about a year ago, an Englishman giving his impressions of the Canadian people, remarked on the prevalence of profanity wherever he went—the shame of Canada. Doesn't Dr. Lounsbury's deliverance remind us that "swearing is specially characteristic of a rude and imperfect civilization?" Time for us to mend our manners and habits.

A. M. Loughney, an athlete, who has been studying jiu-jitsu in Japan, says that the Japs are beginning to take a great interest in American boxing, and that a great prize-fighter will undoubtedly be barned out by that country some day.


"The Jap," says Loughney, "is by nature a fighter. If he turned to prize-fighting he would be more a fighter than a boxer. His head and jaw are shaped like a fighting animal's, and he has what prize-fighters call the "heart." He can fight a losing battle like an Irishman. In studying jiu-jitsu I have found that the Japanese are not nearly as susceptible to pain as we are. Jiu-jitsu is terribly painful and dangerous. If they can put up with that they can stand prize-fighting and not mind the punishment.

"I taught a number how to box while in Japan. They know very little about it, but learn very quickly on account of their rapid sword play. Their main disadvantage is in the shortness of their reach.
