Though the room be poor indeed.

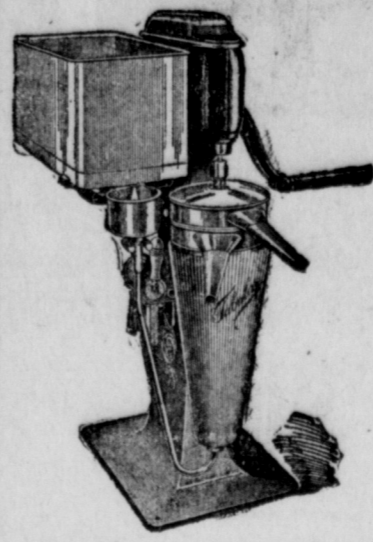
Give a man a girl he can love,
