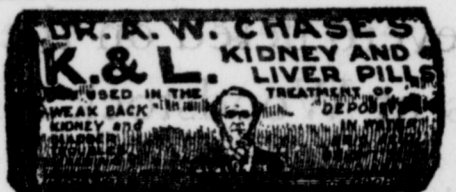

Practical Fashions.

For little girls or boys there is a new sweater knit from silk.

It is the slip-over kind, but there need not be a darkened struggle inside with only the opening of the neck to suggest the way out. This new style is buttoned on one shoulder and the side of the high collar.

For ornamentation a conventional flower design is worked in wallachian stitch on the front. For little boys there are shields, eagles or flags.

Warmth is assured, and the uncomfortable bulkiness of woolen sweaters is eliminated.

Brocade is much favored for bridesmaid's hats. Perhaps it solves the color problem as well, for it is always possible to secure just the right shade of blue or pink at the silk counter when the felt hats offer no assistance to eager buyers.

Large shapes are popular, and plumes of the same color or contrasting tones are used. The design of the brocade seems especially ornamental and suitable for festive occasions. After the great event, these silk hats are lovely for evening wear.

We have been treated to various edgings for the panner, but one of the latest is a puffing about one-half inch in width. It is of the same material as the over-drapery, and the shirred effect is probably produced by a cord underneath.

This new idea, by the way, sweeps over the skirt, and on one side, at the bottom of the gown, ends in a huge bow of the material held in place by a jet buckle. The loops

and ends are edged in the same way as the panner.

For your dressy hat, why not make your own hatpins of lace? An old form can be covered with a crocheted medallion or lace flower. The stitches must necessarily be close in order to cover the foundation, but when an Irish lace daisy curls its petals over a hatpin, you will pierce your crown with joy in the knowledge of having something home-made but new.

Not the least startling of the many autumn drapery ideas is the one-sleeved coat of chiffon that slips over the left arm and hangs over the right shoulder with many graceful folds. Indeed the wrap is extraordinary, and ranks for the moment as a novelty pure and simple. Perhaps, as the season progresses, it may find its place and be accepted with a dress of a certain type.

The return of the blouse and separate skirt restores the sash and belt to favor, and some attractive styles of leather and silk are ready for your approval.

Satiny folds encircle the waist line, while scarf ends are knotted at the back. Leather in supple form is studded with stones and beads.

Belts are wide, and this, of course, is joyful news to women who have struggled for smartness with narrow bands at their waists. Under five inches of shirred or folded silk a multitude of sins against neatness can be hidden.

Nearly every belt must have its large buckle. This important part of the girdle is sometimes four inches in width. Some are highly polished, while others are made as a concession to the liking for antique and barbaric designs.

Jewels are introduced with filigree and carvings, the color of the stones being a reflection of that of the silk or leather.

Heavy silk thread and cord are embroidered in motifs that hint of the east in both color and design.

Look to your belts in this day of the return of the waist line. They can make or mar the appearance of your costume.

Solid embroidery is still trailing over the tiniest of tucks and is used in small and large flower patterns.

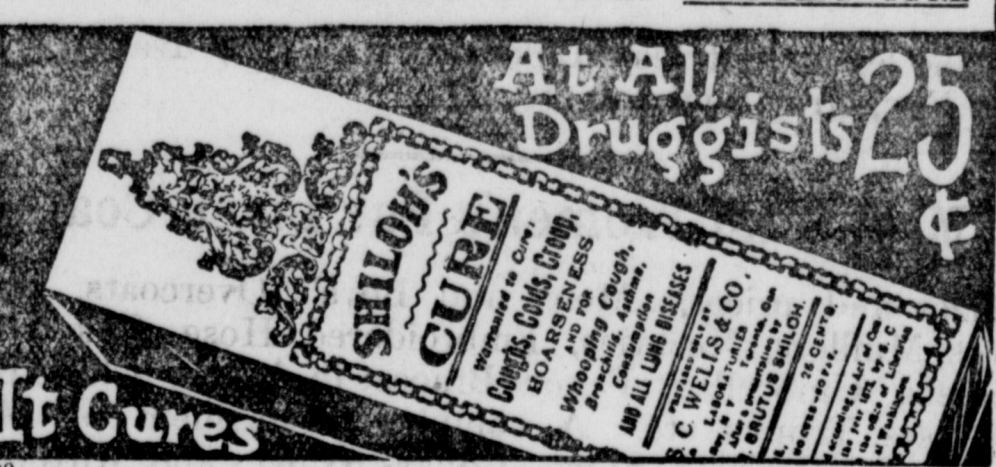
